FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

March for Life, Ottawa, 2016.

"Why do bad things happen to good people?" That is a question for which there is no easy answer. The Book of Job in the Bible deals specifically with this question. Job is a righteous man, but in spite of his righteousness he loses everything that he holds dear. His possessions are stolen and his children die tragically. He is afflicted with a painful disease and he has nothing left to live for.

Job is visited by friends who insist that he must have done something wrong to deserve this kind of punishment. Job insists on his innocence. In the end, God makes an appearance. God praises Job and rebukes his friends. So why did Job suffer? Not as a punishment for sin but because suffering is simply a fact of human existence.

Pope Leo XIII said:

To bear and to suffer is the ordinary condition of man. Man can no more create for himself a life free from suffering and filled only with happiness than he can abolish the decrees of his Divine Maker, who has willed that the consequences of original sin should be perpetual. It is reasonable, therefore, not to expect an end to troubles in this world, but rather to steel one's soul to bear troubles, by which we are taught to look forward with certainty to supreme happiness.

Christ has not promised eternal happiness in heaven to riches, nor to a life of ease, to honors or to power, but to long-suffering and to tears, to the love of justice and to cleanness of heart.

We forget sometimes how fortunate we are to live in a time and place where there is so little suffering compared to past times. The Irish immigrants who settled in these parts were survivors of the potato famines and the cholera ships. Even in this new land, life was hard. Walk through our graveyards and look at the old headstones — see how many died young, often not seeing their first birthday.

Bad things happen to good people. I can accept that. The more difficult question is:

"Why do good people do bad things?"

The people promoting abortion and euthanasia do not see themselves as bad people. They will insist that they are very good people. They care about the homeless and global warming. They recycle. They turn off their lights for earth hour. But they see nothing wrong with killing the innocent child in the womb or the person with a debilitating illness. In fact, they rejoice in it. It is as if some part of their normal human conscience has been switched off.

The recent visit of the Sisters of Life reminded me of what a crisis pregnancy counselor once told me: "There is not a single woman who has regretted the decision to give birth to her child." Life is an amazing gift. St. Augustine said of "unwanted" children: "Even when we do not want them, when we see them, they make us love them."
