FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The threshing floor.

Bishop Robert Barron has just come out with a small book entitled Letter to a Suffering Church. He describes the current crisis in the Church as "a diabolical masterpiece, one that has compromised the work of the Church in every way and has left countless lives in ruins." However, "reading the current crisis through the lenses of Scripture and Church history," he shows "that we have faced such egregious scandals before; that the spiritual treasures of the Church were preserved by holy men and women who recommitted themselves to fighting evil; and that there is a clear path forward for us today."

St. Augustine faced similarly distressing circumstances 1600 years ago and his advice is still applicable today:

Do not be surprised at how many bad Christians there are who fill the church. The Church is compared to a threshing-floor, having on it grain mixed with chaff, having bad members mixed with the good. However, the one is coming, who will have a winnowing fan in his hand, and will cleanse the threshing-floor; and he will gather his wheat together into the granary, while the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.

You who are grain, do not attempt to separate yourself from the chaff; because if you want to separate yourself now from the chaff, you won't be able to stay on the threshing-floor. And when that one comes who distinguishes infallibly between grain and chaff, he won't carry up to the granary anything he does not find on the threshing-floor. So then, dearly beloved, if you are good, you must put up with the bad; do not let the mixture of husk depress you; they won't be with you forever.

Pope Emeritus Benedict has also recently written on our current troubles. He refers to the book of Job, where Job is tempted, because of his sufferings, to curse God:

Today, the accusation against God is, above all, about characterizing His Church as entirely bad, and thus dissuading us from it. The idea of a better Church, created by ourselves, is in fact a proposal of the devil, with which he wants to lead us away from the living God, through a deceitful logic by which we are too easily duped. No, even today the Church is not just made up of bad fish and weeds. The Church of God also exists today, and today it is the very instrument through which God saves us.

It is very important to oppose the lies and half-truths of the devil with the whole truth: Yes, there is sin in the Church and evil. But even today there is the Holy Church, which is indestructible. Today there are many people who humbly believe, suffer and love, in whom the real God, the loving God, shows Himself to us. Today God also has His witnesses in the world. We just have to be vigilant in order to see and hear them.
