FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Arise from darkness.

Lately I've been thinking about the more serious challenges of life. As a priest, I am so often present when people are dealing with serious illness or the loss of a loved one. One of my first hospital calls as Associate Pastor was to minister to the family of an eighteen-year-old girl who had been killed in a hit and run. When the call came in I went to the Pastor and said "You better take this one. I don't think I can handle it." He just said, "This call came in to you. You will have to handle it."

I have been told that because I had a professional career prior to entering the priesthood, that this has given me valuable experience of "real life." But nothing in all my years of Engineering prepared me for that night. I learned more about "real life" in my first month as a priest than in my whole career as an Engineer.

On the way to the hospital I tried to think what I could possibly say to the family. Nothing I could say would be adequate, so I stopped thinking and started praying. When I arrived I still had not found any words, but the family was not looking for words, just a reminder of the presence of God in their time of grief. I was able to be that presence for them. The shortest verse in the Bible is John 11:35; it is in the story of Jesus at the tomb of Lazarus: "Jesus wept."

My first funeral Mass was for a beloved great-greatgrandmother who had passed away peacefully at the age of ninety-five. Of course, there was some sadness, but much more a sense of completion. Like St. Paul, she had fought the good fight, finished the race and kept the faith.

I have also done funerals for young children thankfully few of them — and for men and women in the prime of their lives. These are never easy. Faith gives us courage to bear our grief, but it does not lessen it. St. Augustine, did not cry when he lost his beloved mother, Monica:

I closed her eyes, and a great wave of sorrow surged in my heart. It would have overflowed in tears if I had not made a strong effort of will and stemmed the flow. What a terrible struggle it was to hold them back! But later, as I lay alone in bed, it was a comfort to me to weep for her and for myself. The tears which I had been holding back streamed down, and I let them flow as freely as they would, making of them a pillow for my heart.

I have been reading Fr. Benedict Groeschel, Arise from Darkness: What to Do When Life Doesn't Make Sense. This holy priest had much more experience of real life than I will ever have. He not only helped others in times of tragedy, but lived through tragedies in his own life. Fr. Groeschel does not offer any easy answers. Nor does he offer "comfort." Faith does not give us comfort, but strength to bear up under sorrow. Faith gives us an assurance that we and those we love — even in the darkest times — are always in the Father's hands.
