Saint of the Week

He who bears the burdens of others, assists all, humbles himself to all, even to his inferiors, and supplies the wants of the poor with what he has received from God, is truly the imitator of God. -Saint Justin the Philosopher (103-165), Feast Day June 1

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Corpus Christi — Body of Christ.

In the sacristy there is a framed notice which says: "Priest of God, offer this Mass as if it were you first Mass; as if it were you last Mass; as if it were your only Mass."

I celebrate the Eucharist every single day and twice on Saturday and Sunday. Add to that funerals, school Masses and retirement home Masses and the average is more than ten Masses per week, fifty-two weeks per year. Over the years, that adds up to a lot of Masses.

But in fact there is only one Mass — each Mass brings us to that singular moment when Jesus sacrificed himself for the redemption of mankind at Calvary. The holy Council of Trent affirmed that each Mass is not a new sacrifice but the *same* sacrifice. The offering of Jesus' body and blood in every Mass is the *same* offering that Jesus made on the cross on Good Friday. At each Mass, that event which happened historically two thousand years ago becomes sacramentally present for us here and now.

The great Benedictine Abbot Anscar Vonier wrote in his book *A Key to the Doctrine of the Eucharist*:

If Mass is all that and only that — the Body and Blood of Christ offered up in sacrifice — then our Catholic worship becomes easy. There could be no two ways of understanding an idea presented with such extreme literalness, because every man would know what is meant by Christ's Body, what is understood by Christ's Blood, what is signified by a sacrifice.

After everything has been said, after a careful study of all the issues and of all the implications of so great a mystery as is the Eucharist, the fullness of Eucharistic truth is contained in this: that Christ's Body and Christ's Blood, nothing more, nothing less, nothing holier, nothing lower, is offered up on the Catholic Altar. The superior privilege of Christendom is in the infinite sanctity of the two things, Body and Blood.

After eight years of celebrating Mass daily — and Fr. Bennett has been doing the same for sixty-five years — each Mass is still a treasured moment for being in the presence of the Lord. While I certainly appreciate those times when someone else takes on the responsibility of preaching the homily, or those rare occasions where another priest takes the lead as celebrant and I can participate simply as one of the faithful, I cannot imagine going through an entire day without the Eucharist.

Every priest gets asked the question: "Why did you decide to become a priest?" There is no simple answer. But it always involves a profound attraction to the Eucharist — not necessarily any desire to celebrate it, but always an intense desire to be close to it. The Eucharist is the heart and soul of the priesthood — the priest lives to offer the sacrifice of the Mass each day, and it is the Mass that makes and sustains his vocation to the priesthood.


