FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Rejoice in the Lord always — again, I say, rejoice.

Christians are supposed to be joyful! We are supposed to abound in the fruit of the Holy Spirit: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." Nevertheless, the truth is that there are times when I am anxious and fearful. Am I then lacking in faith? Does it mean that the Holy Spirit is not in me?

St. Paul himself admits to being "under daily pressure because of my *anxiety* for all the churches. Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to stumble, and I am not indignant?" St. Paul was no stranger to anxiety and fear. It was in the *midst* of tribulation that he turned to God for strength and comfort. "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me."

How it is that anxiety and trust can exist at the same time? I don't really know, but I know that they do. I am afraid of heights, yet every year at camp I climb to the top of the pole, heart pounding, but trusting in the climbing harness and the instructor. Scared? Yes. Trusting? Yes.

A book that I am currently reading has Jesus say this:

A troubled heart is always an indication of one's lack of trust in me. Trouble, interior disquiet, comes from wanting to control and manage the things that are better left to my Father's providence. At every moment I provide you with occasions to trust me and to abandon to me the things that we would prefer to see other than they are. Whenever we come up against something that contradicts our plans or fails to meet our expectations, give that thing, that situation, that disappointment to my heart, and then relinquish all worry over it.

I am not distant from you nor am I removed from your life. Make frequent acts of trust and abandonment. Let go of the things that you cling to most tightly. Come to me with empty hands. Hold on to nothing, not even to your own plans and desires for good things. If the things that you want for yourself are good, know, beyond any doubt, that the things I want for you are infinitely better.

The things that weigh upon you most heavily, the things that cause you the most anxiety and distress, are the very things that I want you to abandon to me. When something becomes a cause of anguish, or makes you fearful, or robs your heart of peace, give that thing to me immediately, and once you have given it to me, think of it no more.

I find that passage both challenging and comforting. Yes, there will be times when we do not feel inner peace and joy, but rather acute anxiety and distress. We should not deny the reality of our emotions or feel added guilt because of our lack of faith. Rather, we should acknowledge the reality our anxieties and then put everything into the hands of our Lord. Let him calm our heart and give us the peace of the Holy Spirit — even in the midst of our trials.
