
## St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

What the Spirit is saying to the Churches.

The bedrock principle of the Protestant Reformation was sola scriptura — the Bible alone. Most of the mainline Protestant denominations no longer look on the Bible as a reliable authority. Instead, they prefer to be guided by "the Spirit": "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit is saying to the Churches." And what the Spirit is saying to them today is very different from what that same Spirit was saying to the Apostles.

The process of detaching Christianity from Scripture has been going on for a long time. According to one church historian, "The whole history of the nineteenth century compellingly demonstrates the power of an idea whose time had come: the value of the individual person validated by the internal authority of reason, not by the external authority of religion." During this time, the Modernists, within the Catholic Church, were promoting the idea that "the categories of existing Catholicism were elastic enough to accommodate themselves to the latest results of historical and critical research and to the requirement of modern life — ethical, economical and social."

This sounds somewhat like the aggiornamento (bringing up to date) that Pope John XXIII intended as the purpose of the Second Vatican Council. But Pope John insisted on novi sed non nova — teaching in a new way but not teaching new things. The Council itself confirmed that the Catholic Church draws her faith from Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, as from a single source. This is the true voice of the Spirit speaking to the Church. As St. Paul said, "But even if we or an angel from heaven should proclaim to you a gospel contrary to what we proclaimed to you, let that one be accursed. As we have said before, so now I repeat, if anyone proclaims to you a gospel contrary to what you received, let that one be accursed!"

As Catholics we hold fast to the word of Sacred Scripture, which we receive not as the word of man but, as it truly is, the Word of God. Sacred Tradition is not a "supplement" or "add-on" to the Bible. Rather the written word and the living Tradition go hand in hand.

As Karl Adam wrote in The Spirit of Catholicism:

The writings of the Apostles and Evangelists point beyond themselves to the supernatural life of faith of the primitive church, whence they themselves grew. The New Testament does not stand outside this life of faith as a special and independent source; it stands within this life. It is supported and dominated by this life, for there were many Christian communities already in existence before any Apostle took up his pen. Consequently the Bible possesses no independent authority apart from the faith of the Church. Throughout the New Testament we descry the gleam of the living waters of the primitive faith, which supports the Bible and from which alone the Bible gets its stability, as it does its final interpretation.
