

# FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Jerusalem Temple and the new Temple.

The Temple in Jerusalem was a magnificent building complex. It was one of the wonders of the ancient world. Jesus, teaching in that Temple, prophesied that it would be destroyed, so that "not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down."

Within the lifetime of many of those hearers, the Jewish people revolted against Roman rule. The Romans sent in their armies and laid siege to Jerusalem. After their victory, the Romans had the Temple completely destroyed, not leaving a single stone. What is now known as the "wailing wall" was not actually part of the Temple, but a retaining wall for the temple mount. Today a Muslim shrine, the Dome of the Rock, stands where the Temple once stood.

The Jewish revolt entailed tremendous suffering and loss of life. With the destruction of the Temple the survivors lost their place of worship, where the *shekinah*, the "glory of the Lord" dwelt. Only in the Temple could sacrifice be offered to God. The Jewish people would come from every part of Judea and Galilee, and even from abroad, to go up to the Jerusalem to celebrate the great festivals, especially the festival of the Passover. The destruction of the Temple meant the end of all these religious observances.

The destruction of the Temple was also a great blow for Christians. Although the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross made an end to all need for animal sacrifice, Christians still considered the Temple a sacred place. They would regularly go to there to pray. It was in the Temple that St. Paul was arrested for the last time. We should note that those first Jewish Christians were not "converts" — as Jews they were waiting for the Messiah, as Christians they recognized that he had come.

Jesus warned about the end of the Temple, but he also said that he would rebuild it in three days. He was talking about his body, the Church. The Temple made of stone was destroyed. The spiritual Temple, the Church, was established and was being built up. The animal sacrifices in Jerusalem came to an end, but the sacrifice of Christ's body and blood was now offered on every altar in every Church in every part of the world.

This Temple not made by human hands will stand firm forever, but that does not mean that it will not face troubles. When we look at the state of the Church today, we are well aware that there is active persecution in many nations and that there has been a veritable eclipse of faith in most of Europe and in our own country. What Cardinal Newman more than a century ago predicted as a "coming age of irreligion" is upon us. The Western democracies have fully embraced what Pope John Paul II called the "culture of death." The future is by no means free of anxiety, but we have the promise of Christ to St. Peter: "On this rock I will build my Church and the gates of hell will not prevail against it."
