## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The medium is the message

That famous dictum of Marshall McLuhan is often misunderstood and sometimes derided, but it explains why the Catholic Church has for centuries been singing the Kyrie Eleison ("Lord have mercy") in Greek in the Latin Mass, and why we still do it in our English Mass.

The Roman Empire in the 4<sup>th</sup> century was divided into two: the Latin-speaking West, and the Greek-speaking East. The Catholic Church, however, was not divided — the one Church extended throughout the known world. The Greek Kyrie was a reminder in the Latin Mass that we were still united with the Greek-speaking East. Or, as Pope John Paul II put it, that the Church breathes with two lungs (West and East). The whole point of the Kyrie, the only reason for having it, was that it was in Greek.

When the Mass was being overhauled after Vatican II, some prominent liturgists suggested eliminating the Kyrie altogether. Others suggested that it be used only during Advent and Lent, when the Gloria is not sung. In the end the Kyrie was kept.

The reason? Because of the long tradition of sacred music associated with it — not only the ancient Gregorian Chant, but also many brilliant compositions for choir or orchestra, such as those by Palestrina and Mozart. This musical tradition was considered a treasure too precious to discard. Its loss indeed would have been a tragedy.

The version of the Kyrie that we sing at our Mass is the simplest of Gregorian melodies, the one that traditionally was sung as part of the funeral Mass. For weekday Masses, I use an even simpler Kyrie from the Litany of the Saints at the Easter Vigil. In any case, like the Gloria, the Kyrie is meant to be sung. And except for the rare times when I lose my voice, I do always sing it. There are Churches where the Kyrie is spoken in English, but then what's the point?

There is one other time when we use Greek in the Liturgy — on Good Friday. In the early Middle Ages, pilgrims returning from the Holy Land introduced the "Trisagion" into the Latin Liturgy: *Agios o Theos, Agios ischyros, Agios athanatos, eleison imas.* "Holy God, holy mighty one, holy immortal one, have mercy on us." The point of this was to recreate in their own celebration of the Good Friday liturgy what was happening during the celebration in Jerusalem at the Holy Sepulcher.

We continue that beautiful tradition — these simple Greek phrases unite us not only with the celebration at the Holy Sepulcher but also with every other celebration in every other Church around the world. That is the tremendous symbolic power of the Liturgy.

Again, just like the Kyrie, if the Trisagion wasn't in Greek, there would be no point to it. A translation into English does not help us understand the message, it completely obscures the message — because, in this case, Greek is not the medium, it is the message.


