FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Say the black and do the red.

Five years have now passed since the introduction of the current English translation of the Roman Missal. This was the first step in a revision of all the liturgical books. The previous translations were prepared hurriedly following the Second Vatican Council with the expectation that they would be replaced within fifteen or twenty years. The work of revision actually took more than twice that long and it is not yet completed. So far, we have received the new Rite of Confirmation and the Rite of Marriage. We are still waiting for the updated Rite of Baptism and the Rite of Funerals.

With regard to the Lectionary (the book of Scripture readings), a new book of Sunday readings was issued in 2009 and we now have a separate Book of the Gospels and a Lectionary for Weddings and Funerals. The new Lectionary for Weekday Masses has not yet been published.

With regard to the celebration of the Mass and the other Rites, the priest is strictly obligated to “go by the book.” Canon Law states: “The liturgical books, approved by the competent authority, are to be faithfully followed in the celebration of the Sacraments. Accordingly, no one may on a personal initiative add to or omit or alter anything in those books.” Even the Pope is bound by the law of the Church. The Pope, in his role as chief legislator, has the authority to change the law but he is not free to violate it.

The faithful have the right to have Mass celebrated according to the Missal. Within the Missal, however, there are many options for the different parts of the Mass. For example, it is an acceptable option to sing, as we do, the *Kyrie*, the *Sanctus* and the *Angus Dei* in Latin. In fact, the General Instruction for the Missal states that “it is desirable that the people know how to sing at least some parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin”, and that “the main place, all things being equal, should be given to Gregorian (Latin) Chant, as being proper to the Roman Liturgy.”

There are several options for the Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass, from which I use either the *Confiteor* (the “I confess”) or, during the Easter season, the rite of sprinkling with Holy Water. The Nicene Creed has been sung in the Mass since at least the time of Pope Gregory in the sixth century, but it is now permitted to substitute the Apostles' Creed. When it comes to the Eucharistic Prayer, there are *ten* different ones to choose from, not including the additional three for Children's Mass (of which, the less said, the better). The first Eucharistic Prayer is the ancient Roman Canon, whose origins are lost in the mists of time.

The actual shape of the Mass will depend on the choice of options. The priest however is not allowed to go beyond those options. The liturgical books must be faithfully followed. In the Missal, the words that the priest says are printed in black, and the instructions for his actions are printed in red. The Priest, with whatever options he chooses, is required to say the black and do the red.
