FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

There is no such thing as an atheist.

Twenty years ago, if you had asked me if I believed in God, I would have honestly said, "No, I am an atheist." Then one day I realized that I was no longer an atheist. I tried to figure out when exactly the change had taken place. But I realized that there was no point when I stopped being an atheist and started being a believer. In fact, I had never been an atheist at all.

Cardinal Newman says that faith is a reflective act: it is knowing that you know. I had always known that there is a God. For a long time, however, I did not know that I knew.

It is the same with everyone who denies the existence of God, especially those who say, "I believe in Science." Stephen Hawking is truly a brilliant scientist. But in one of his books, *The Grand Design*, he writes the following:

The multiverse concept can explain the fine tuning of physical law without the need for a benevolent creator. Because there is a law of gravity, the Universe can and will create itself from nothing. Spontaneous creation is the reason there is something rather than nothing, why the Universe exists, why we exist.

St. Thomas Aquinas notes that for anything to exist at all there must be a first cause which is itself not caused: "And this is what all people refer to when they speak of God." To identify the uncaused cause as the "law of gravity" or to speak of "spontaneous creation out of nothing" is simply nonsensical. It is silly and puerile.

Pope Leo XIII understood this:

When men withdraw their intellect from the knowledge of divine truths, they are less fitted to succeed in the pursuit even of natural science. This is why we often see men of great intellectual power and erudition making the grossest blunders even in natural science.

Or to quote a more recent author, Fr. J. R. Neuhaus:

There is, in a perverse way, something admirable in the persistence of these proponents of atheism. I have in my time read more than my share of arguments for atheism and have yet to encounter one that is aimed at debunking the God in whom I believe. Put differently, I, too, do not believe in the God in whom they do not believe. The reality of that which surpasses understanding is not disproved by the recognition that it surpasses understanding. And around [the musings of such atheists as Hawking and company] hovers the unacknowledged presence of that which is so persistently, so zealously, so desperately denied.

Or as St. Paul wrote to the Christians in Rome:

For what can be known about God is plain to them. Ever since the creation of the world his eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things he has made. So they are without excuse. — Rom 1:19-20.
