FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Moving forward & changing with the times.

A couple weeks ago, on the evening of the U.S. elections, the Church office was broken into and some cash was taken. The office door and a file cabinet were jimmied but nothing else was damaged and nobody was injured. It seems that the break-in occurred while there were people in the Church — our alarm system was therefore not active.

This break-in came at an unfortunate time, as we had already signed a contract to have security cameras installed and were waiting for the work to begin. Our current alarm system was installed at both St. Paul's and Immaculate Conception Churches two years ago, for both fire and illegal entry detection. For additional security we also upgraded the outdoor lighting at both Churches.

We have been discussing our security needs for some time but we were very reluctant to take the next logical step of putting in cameras. After all, this is Alliston, not Toronto. However, with the present office layout it is impossible for the office staff to see who is entering the building, and this simply does not make for a safe workplace.

The security cameras have now been installed. The Secretary, at her desk, can see the public areas of the Church: the outside front patio, the foyer, the hallway and the Church Sanctuary. She has the option of locking the main Church doors and buzzing people in. The "buzzer" is the same type of video entrance system that is now used in all our schools. A separate alarm keypad has been installed for the office, so that the office can be secured while the rest of the Church building is in use. This brings our security system up to a reasonably modern standard.

It is unfortunate that we have needed to do all this, but safety has to be our first priority. Everyone is still welcome to drop into the Church anytime during regular hours to pray. If the main doors are locked, just ring the doorbell.

And now for something completely different —

This Sunday is the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, the feast of Christ the King, *Christus Rex.* Next Sunday, 27 November, is the first of the four Sundays of Advent. Christmas this year will fall on a Sunday. Our Christmas Eve Masses will be on the Saturday per our usual Christmas schedule. The Solemnity of Mary (New Year's Day) is also on a Sunday, with the regular weekend schedule.

Advent is the beginning of the new liturgical year. The Church gives us this liturgical seasons as a means of deepening our spiritual lives. December is a busy month, and while getting into the "spirit of Christmas" we should not neglect to cultivate the spirit of prayer. We need to remember "the reason for the season" and to "keep Christ is Christmas." Let us open our hearts to experience the true joy of Advent and Christmas. Our world is changing, and in many ways not for the better. All the more reason to hold on to the things that are really important. Happy Advent!
