FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

What she was, that she is.

C. S. Lewis, an admirable Christian writer, in an essay entitled *Christian Reunion*, wrote:

The real reason why I cannot be in communion with you [Catholics] is not my disagreement with this or that Roman doctrine, but that to accept your Church means, not to accept a given body of doctrine, but to accept in advance any doctrine your Church hereafter produces.

Lewis is of course completely mistaken in the idea that the Catholic Church can "produce" doctrine. As Catholics we have a rule of faith — our "constitution" — which is Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition taken together. Sacred Tradition is that deposit of faith which the Church has believed and taught from the beginning. It cannot be added to, and it cannot be subtracted from. It can only be apprehended more deeply and explained more fully.

As Cardinal Newman once wrote: "The Church cannot change: what she was, that she is; what our forefathers were, such are we." Or as St. Augustine said fourteen centuries earlier: "They had preserved what they had found, taught what they had learned, and transmitted to their sons what they had received from their fathers."

Some people think that the doctrine of "Papal Infallibility" means that the Pope can produce doctrine — in fact it means exactly the opposite. The definition of Papal Infallibility given by the First Vatican Council states:

For the Holy Spirit was not promised to the successors of Peter that by His revelation they might make known new doctrine, but that by His assistance they might inviolably keep and faithfully expound the revelation or deposit of faith delivered through the Apostles.

When it was proposed during the Second Vatican Council that the Pope was answerable only to God, Pope Paul VI insisted:

The Pope is also bound to revelation itself, to the fundamental structure of the Church, to the sacraments, to the definitions of earlier councils, and other obligations too numerous to mention.

Many people expect the Church to introduce changes in doctrine, but it simply cannot be done. It can't be done by any theologian or group of theologians; it can't be done by any Bishop or any Synod of Bishops or even by any Ecumenical Council; it can't be done by any Pope. It can't be done by anyone. It can't be done at all.

As Cardinal Manning, one of the bishops who took part in the First Vatican Council, explained:

All Catholics believe that the Catholic Church is infallible in faith and morals — that is, the Church is so divinely guarded that she never departs from the divine tradition of revealed truth. This all Catholics believe; no one who denies it is a Catholic. Whosoever doubts it ceases to be a Catholic.
