FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The challenge of faith

Today, as we celebrate the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Feast of Christ the King (*Christus Rex*), we are also at the end of the Year of Faith. This year marked the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council and the 20th anniversary of the publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. This past year we were invited to learn more about our faith and to consider how we put it into practice.

Faith is not a feeling. Faith is a choice. It is a choice that engages the whole of one's being, including the intellect, but not excluding the heart and soul. What has happened in our current culture is that men's hearts are turned away from God. Without the light of faith, the human intellect is darkened, and we fall into folly. We no longer know right from wrong, true from false and we make the grossest blunders even in natural science.

It is remarkable how atheism compels even intelligent men to say ridiculous things. Stephen Hawking is a brilliant scientist, but he believes that "because there is a law of gravity, the Universe can and will create itself from nothing." That is utter nonsense. It is not religious nonsense, it is scientific nonsense. *Ex nihil, nihil fit* — nothing comes from nothing.

The resurrection of Christ is miraculous. To believe it is a matter of faith. But "spontaneous creation" from nothing? That is truly unbelievable.

The last few decades have been a veritable new "golden age" of Catholic teaching. Like the wise steward in the parable who brings out of his storehouse treasures both new and old, Catholic publishers have been offering an abundance of excellent books by new authors as well as modern translations of the Christian classics. There are many good Catholic web sites. And we have EWTN and Salt+Light TV.

Christianity has not lost the intellectual battle with atheism or agnosticism. The intellectual grounds for the Christian faith have never been stronger — the arguments for atheism have never been weaker. So how is it that we have fallen into a new age of paganism?

The old pagan religions were attractive because they pandered to the weakness of our fallen nature — they made few demands other than the occasional sacrifice. In honor of Bacchus, the God of wine, you could indulge in a drunken orgy. Not many people today would find fault with that kind of religion.

aith is a choice. We can choose to order our lives according to faith in a God who gives our lives meaning and purpose. Or we can choose not to. But it not simply a matter of intellectual assent to the truths about God. It is not only an intellectual choice, but a moral choice.
