



FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The riches of the Church's faith and prayer.

There is an old joke: A mother gives her son two sweaters for Christmas. The next time he visits, he is wearing one of the sweaters. His mother says, "So, you don't like the other sweater?"

The Church gives us the option of saying either the Nicene Creed or the Apostle's Creed in the Mass. Both are equally good. But if we say the Nicene Creed, someone is bound to say, "So, you don't like the Apostles' Creed?"

The choice between acceptable options should need no justification. However, if pressed, I would say, firstly, that until recent decades the Nicene Creed has always been used in the Mass; it is the more traditional option. Then there is also this: we say the Apostles' Creed every day when we pray the Rosary; if we did not recite the Nicene Creed at Sunday Mass, when would we ever say it?

The Creed (the *Credo*), the *Kyrie*, the *Gloria*, the *Sanctus*, and the *Agnus Dei* make up the 'Ordinary of the Mass,' and they are meant to be sung. The musical setting may be as simple as ancient Gregorian chant or as grand as Palestrina's *Missa Papae Marcelli*. When the Mass was revised after the Second Vatican Council, these parts were kept unchanged expressly because of this rich musical heritage. According to the Council: "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art."

According to the latest *General Instruction on the Roman Missal*: "The main place should be given, all things being equal, to Gregorian chant, as being proper to the Roman Liturgy... It is desirable that they [the faithful] know how to sing together at least some of the parts of the Ordinary of the Mass in Latin ... according to the simpler settings." These simpler settings are included in the altar Missal and in the pew hymnals.

The Pastor has the duty of seeing that the Mass is celebrated according to the approved liturgical books. On the one hand, this means simply, 'say the black and do the red,' but it also means choosing from among many equally valid options. It is a balance between the local custom of the parish, the Pastor's personal preferences, and what the liturgical guidelines call 'pastoral advantage.'

On Saturday evenings, we sing the seasonal "Marian Antiphon.' In Ordinary Time this is the *Salve Regina*, but in Advent it is the *Alma Redemptoris Mater*, 'Loving Mother of our Redeemer.' This does not really belong in the Mass, but it is sung every night by priests as the closing hymn of the Divine Office. We have added it to the end of our Saturday celebration because we ought to know and love these beautiful traditional hymns to Our Lady.

As Pope Benedict XVI has said, "What earlier generations held as sacred remains sacred and great for us too. It behoves all of us to preserve the riches which have developed in the Church's faith and prayer."
