FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Keep calm and trust in God.

The Christian is in the world but not of the world. His life must necessarily be different from that of someone without faith. His conduct, his habits of life, his way of thinking, of making choices, of evaluating things and situations, are different, because they happen in the light of Christ's words, which are a message of everlasting life. — Pope John Paul II.

We are living in unsettled times. As Pope Leo XIII said at the beginning of the last century: "The outlook on the future is by no means free of anxiety." The twentieth century turned out to be the bloodiest century in history. I am not worried about possible global conflict, but I am very concerned about our post-Christian culture which has turned its back on God and embraced what Pope John Paul II rightly called the "culture of death." With the killing of the child in the womb already enshrined as a "reproductive right," we have now also discovered a right to euthanasia — the legal killing of the old, the sick and the depressed. As this becomes law, true rights of religion and of conscience are disregarded and collaboration with evil is coerced.

Back in the early 1960's, sociologist Peter Berger noted that "church membership in no way means adherence to a set of values at variance with those of the general society; rather, it means a stronger and more explicitly religious affirmation of the same values held by the community at large." He was speaking of the mainline Protestant denominations and he made an exception for the Catholic Church: "Those who are concerned with the fusion of culture and religion owe a measure of gratitude to Catholicism, which has remained in a state of tension with the overall culture — and thus provides an important witness that is not simply a reflection of secular values."

From a Catholic perspective, Thomas Merton, saw things in much the same light. "The great tragedy of our age is that there are so many Christians whose religion is a matter of pure conformism and expediency. These 'believers' cling together, offering one another an apparent justification for lives that are essentially the same as the lives of their materialistic neighbors whose horizons are purely those of the world and of it transient values."

It has been over fifty years since these things were written, and the truth of these observations has become more and more apparent. And yet, there are signs of hope. The Catholic Church still stands firm against the "spirit of the age," the *Zeitgeist*, and will, by the grace of the Holy Spirit, continue to do so.

As St. Augustine has said: "The Church will totter if its foundation shakes; but how can Christ be moved?...Christ remaining immovable, it (the Church) shall never be shaken. Where are they that say that the Church has disappeared from the world, when it cannot even be shaken?"
