### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

When are we going to begin to serve God?

Something has gone very wrong with us and with the world of which we are a part. The world is not and we are not what we know was meant to be. That is the most indubitable of truths: it is beyond dispute, it weighs with self-evident force upon every mind and heart that has not lost the sensibility that makes us human. — R. J. Neuhaus.

St. Augustine wrote his great work *The City of God* as the Christian response to the collapse of the Roman Empire. Alaric and the Goths had sacked Rome in 410 A.D. Later, the Goths invaded North Africa and besieged Augustine's own city of Hippo. St. Augustine died during the siege.

Lately, it has been hard to resist the feeling that we are living through a similar time of social collapse. On the one hand, we in the "great western democracies" have never been so well off in material things; on the other hand, we have never been so impoverished intellectually and morally.

I recently read an account of poor village life written in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The writer complained that "the morals of the people had degenerated to the lowest depth." I wondered about that. What is the *lowest* depth? Does that even mean anything to us today? They had certainly not sunk so low as to celebrate Gay Pride Week. Nor did they kill off the sick and elderly and call it "end of life care."

When I look around, it seems that we have lost the basic knowledge of good and evil, of right and wrong. We seem hell-bent on rushing down the broad way that leads to destruction.

But it is *not* true that we do not know the difference between good and evil. These are things that we *can't not know!* They are hardwired into our human nature, written on the human heart. Cicero, the pagan philosopher and statesman who lived before the time of Christ knew this:

There is in fact a true law — right reason — which is in accordance with nature, applies to all men, and is unchangeable and eternal. This law summons men to the performance of their duties, by its prohibitions it restrains them from doing wrong. It will not lay down one rule in Rome and another in Athens, but there will be one law eternal and unchangeable, binding at all times upon all peoples.

We all have been endowed by our Creator with intellect, which we can use to discern the good. We have been endowed with free will in order to choose the good. Yet we can also misuse our intellect to justify evil. We can misuse our freedom to choose the wrong.

St. Paul recognized the inner struggle to overcome our evil tendencies and strive always for the good. He cried out, "Who will deliver me from this body of death?" His answer: "Thanks be to God, through Jesus Christ our Lord."

As this blessed season of Advent begins, let us turn our hearts and minds to God. Let us begin to serve Him.
