#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Four Last Things.

In this month of November, when we pray for those who have died, it is good to recall the Church's teaching on the state of the soul after death. This teaching is often categorized as "the four last things: death, judgment, heaven and hell." It includes the doctrine of Purgatory.

Many people seem to think that Hell and Purgatory were closed down and boarded up sometime in the mid-1960's and that souls are now directed straight to heaven. The publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church in the 1994 should have dispelled this misconception. The Catechism says:

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name "Purgatory" to this final purification. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture speaks of a cleansing fire. ... From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God... Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them.

I perform many funerals, and the funeral homily is not the time to preach about hell and purgatory. But we do need to be reminded beforehand, as part of our general religious education, that the purpose of a Catholic funeral is to offer the Eucharistic Sacrifice for the deceased. In the funeral Mass, we pray for our dear loved one, that his sins will have been forgiven, and that he will quickly be purified from any remaining imperfections and soon be admitted to heaven. A funeral is emphatically not a "celebration of life." It is a celebration of God's abundant mercy. It is a celebration of the redemption that Christ won for us by his death on the cross. It is a celebration of faith and hope.

Yes, Auntie Maggie was a wonderful person and we will miss her terribly, but what matters above all is that she is a beloved child of God, created in God's image and likeness, loved beyond all measure, and she has been called to take the place reserved for her in God's presence in Heaven. But how can she come into God's presence except with a soul cleansed of all imperfections and resplendent with every virtue. That is the purpose of Purgatory.

There is nothing to fear about Purgatory. C. S. Lewis refers to it as an "untwisting" of the twisted soul - an operation that may be painful, but necessary. Would any of us be happy in heaven in our present condition? We would be like the wedding guest in Jesus' parable, not properly outfitted with a wedding garment. I, for one, would like to be made ready for heaven before entering. Thank God for Purgatory, and let us pray for the faithful departed
