FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Knowledge of Good and Evil

Today, freedom from worship prevails everywhere. There is no condign punishment and no social ostracism attached to atheism, and often much prestige. And still one can seldom find a book by a well-known scientist, philosopher, sociologist, historian or psychoanalyst which does not devote pages to lengthy explanations of why the author cannot accept the Divinity of Jesus. Paradoxically enough, in most books by Western authors we are cautioned to hold on to Christian “virtues” and “principles,” but to do away with the belief in the Christ. This is much as though the authors should advocate that we keep our streets and houses well lighted, but do away with power plants.

That was written by Clare Booth Luce back in 1947!

And, of course, we now see that she was right. Who today gives any thought to so-called Christian virtues and principles, except to mock and discredit them? The world has indeed moved on.

Atheists back in the 1800s gained a new respectability when Darwin’s theory of evolution offered an alternative story of creation that left God out of the picture. At the same time, these “new” atheists made a point of living perfectly respectable and moral lives according to Victorian standards. The rejection of God, they insisted, did not mean an abandonment of those principles and morals which were the foundation of Western civilization.

The following generation, however, with perfect logic, saw that principles and morals themselves need a foundation, and the only foundation that Darwin could provide was “the survival of the fittest.”

Although our modern secular “Post-Christian” culture has just about shut down the power plant and the lights have dimmed, there is still reason for hope. Some vestiges of an abandoned faith remain. Most people would still recognize the value of the golden rule — although they may not be able to say *why* I should do unto others as I would have them do unto me.

As Catholic Christians, we profess our faith in Christ and in his Church not because such faith is useful but because it is true. We live as we do because Jesus taught us the two greatest commandments: love God above all things, and love your neighbor as yourself.

Morality — knowing the difference between good and evil — is not *only* a matter of faith, as if it is okay for Christians to live by the golden rule if that strikes their fancy, but the rest of the world can choose some other equally acceptable rule to live by, such as P. T. Barnum’s “There’s a sucker born every minute!” The difference between good and evil is not relative. It is not different for different people depending on one’s point of view. Knowing good from evil is built into our humanity — because we are all created in the image and likeness of God.
