FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

While the worst are full of passionate intensity.

Remembrance Day will be especially poignant this year, following the murders of Warrant Officer Patrice Vincent in Quebec and of Corporal Nathan Cirillo at the War Memorial in Ottawa. Their deaths bring home to us the reality of the heart-breaking atrocities that are being carried out daily in so many parts of the world.

The last few decades have seen the rise of militant Islam as a worldwide calamity — ISIS in Syria and Iraq, the Taliban in Afghanistan and Pakistan, Boko Haram in Nigeria, Hamas in Gaza, the Muslim Brotherhood in Egypt, as well as jihadist movements in North Africa, India, Indonesia and elsewhere. We are now seeing jihadist fighters being recruited from Europe and even from Canada, some of them converts to Islam.

I confess that I cannot fathom what leads ordinary people to support a movement bent on so much death and destruction. How do you justify a movement that beheads children and sells young women into slavery? This is pure evil. But it is not a new evil.

Militant Islam is a totalitarian ideology in which everything must be made subservient to the state — in this case a strictly Islamic state under Sharia law. This however is simply a mutated form, a new version, of the last century's totalitarian ideologies of Communism and Fascism, which came near to dominating the whole world.

After the fall of France, when Britain stood alone against Nazi Germany, Winston Churchill, in one of the greatest speeches of all time, said:

The Battle of France is over. The Battle of Britain is about to begin. Upon this battle depends the survival of Christian civilization. Upon it depends our own British life and the long continuity of our institutions and our Empire. But if we fail, then the whole world, including all that we have known and cared for, will sink into the abyss of a new Dark Age, made more sinister, and perhaps more protracted, by the lights of perverted science.

Churchill understood that the enemy was not the German people, but the evil ideology of Nazism that they had allowed to take over their hearts and minds. During the Cold War, the enemy was not Russia, but Communism.

The defeat of Germany in the Second World War did not defeat the evil. The fall of the Soviet Union did not eliminate it. Like a deadly parasite, this evil has moved to a new host — militant Islam. Let's be clear: the enemy is not Islam or Muslims; the enemy is this parasitic evil that has latched onto Islam to sustain itself.

St. Augustine observed long ago: just as good men use the things of this world to serve God, so evil men do not hesitate to use even God to serve their own evil purposes. Militant Islam is not a religious movement — it is an evil totalitarian ideology using religion as a justification for achieving ideological and political ends.
