### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Fr. Benedict Groeschel, 1933-2014.

We mourn the passing of one of the true heroes of the Catholic Church in this present age. My first encounter with Fr. Groeschel was many years ago in the pages of a book: The Reform of Renewal (Ignatius Press, 1990). Later, I knew him from his association with Mother Angelica on EWTN, the Eternal Word Television Network. Then, in the spring of 2008, I travelled to New York to do my preordination retreat with Fr. Groeschel. Meeting him for the first time in person, he seemed already a long-time friend and mentor. Mine is only one of the lives that Fr. Groeschel touched in his many years of ministry in the Church.

Fr. Groeschel is the founder of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. These friars (i.e., religious brothers) live a life of true poverty, prayer and community, serving the poor in the roughest neighborhoods of New York City. They are "the real deal." They live and work in the Franciscan habit: a grey robe and sandals, and the rope around their waist with its three knots symbolizing their three vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Talk about counter-cultural! I have never encountered a group of young men as joyful as these.

In The Reform of Renewal, one of his many books, Fr. Groeschel wrote about the challenges facing the Church today. He did not suggest that we need another round of discussion and study. As Pope John Paul II also pointed out: we don't need to invent a new program. The program already exists — it is simply the program of the Gospel. We do not need to change institutions and structures. What we need is to change ourselves. What is needed is personal interior transformation. As Fr. Groeschel wrote:

We have lived through years of external changes and socalled reforms that have produced few spiritual results at the present time. Every conceivable aspect of Christian life has been questioned, re-appraised, moved around and restated. The distressing decline of active church participation, the disaffection of large numbers of young people and the general spiritual apathy continue to grow. The time has come to stop talking and start on the long, painful road of personal conversion and reform. Then and only then can true reform happen in the Church.

Fr. Groeschel, a spiritual guide for this present age, quotes the great Doctor of the Church, St. Augustine:

Let your present state always leave you dissatisfied if you want to become what you are not yet. For whenever you feel satisfied then you will stop. Say that it is enough, you are lost. You must always look for more, look beyond, make progress.

True reform can come about only through "personal conversion," which indeed can be a "painful road." The call to conversion was at the heart of Fr. Groeschel's personal life, it was at the heart of his preaching and it is at the heart of the vocation of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal.
