

Saint of the Week

I said aloud that I was a Christian, and could serve no other than Jesus Christ, the Son of God. *St. Marcellus the Centurion* (*d.298*), *Feast Day October 30, Martyr.*

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The devil has no fear of irresolute souls.

Once, for a fleeting moment, I was tempted to doubt the truth of the Catholic faith. Then I realized: I would rather a hundred times over be wrong with St. Teresa of Avila, than right with the whole gang of atheists, agnostics and so-called religious reformers.

There is no life more real than the interior life of the soul; there is no writer who has a firmer hold on reality than St. Teresa.

So wrote Allison Peers, who translated most of her works, and it is impossible to argue with him.

It is common to picture heaven as a boring place filled with bland do-gooders and "plaster saints." Hell, in contrast, is pictured full of fun-loving devil-may-care free spirits. The saying is: "Go to heaven for the climate; go to hell for the company." The reality however is that the souls in hell are so self-centered that there is constant disagreement and bickering. As Sartre put it: Hell is other people.

The Saints in heaven are always in agreement, and so also on earth. If you read the lives of the saints you will find that saints always seem to come in bunches. St. Teresa of Avila was greatly aided in her spiritual life by St. Peter of Alcantara. Her great friend was St. John of the Cross. St. Francis de Sales, though he never met her, was greatly influenced by her and never tires of quoting her.

Are saints boring? Anything but. Ask someone who has met Mother Theresa of Calcutta or Pope John Paul II. Saints can be tough and demanding, but they are never boring.

The way the world deals with boredom is to run after diversions and amusements. St. Augustine pointed out the futility of this, because we have within us an emptiness that only God can fill. As long as we run after the fleeting pleasures the world has to offer, we can never be satisfied. "God, you have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless till they rest in you."

St. Teresa also knew this. We should pay attention to what she tells us about finding true rest for our hearts. For this is the reality. But we need to make a determined start:

I have often thought that St. Peter didn't lose anything when he threw himself into the sea, even though he grew frightened afterwards. These first acts of determination are very important! But I want to warn you, that if you would progress a long way on the road, the important thing is not to *think* much, but to *love* much. Do, then, whatever most arouses you to love. Perhaps we do not know what love is. It would not surprise me a great deal to learn this. For love consists, not in the extent of our happiness, but in the firmness of our determination to try to please God in everything; and to endeavor, in all possible ways, not to offend Him; and to pray him ever to advance the honor and glory of his Son and the growth of the Catholic Church.
