
## St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches



#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Christianity and Liberalism

In the last bulletin, I quoted Martin Luther, who five hundred years ago instigated the Protestant Reformation. It is perfectly true that the Church in Germany in the sixteenth century was badly in need of reform. Luther, however, considered the Catholic Church to be so beyond any possibility of reform that the only solution was to tear everything down and start again from scratch. In doing so, he brought about not a reform, but a separation, a "schism."

Luther was an ordained priest in the Augustinian Order, and it was St. Augustine who wrote: "To start a schism from the Unity of Christ is an immense evil. Regarding anyone who is in schism, it is absolutely impossible that Christ should be for him the source of — I do not say 'faith' — but of his sacrilegious error. It is impossible that anyone who is in schism should have his roots planted in Christ or that Christ should be his source and his Head."

I have nothing good to say about Luther, the "father" of Protestantism, but I certainly have many good things to say about Protestants.

When I was finding my way back to the faith many years ago, one of the great graces was coming across a book written in 1923 by the Presbyterian scholar, J. Gresham Machen, entitled *Christianity and Liberalism*. Another Protestant theologian, H. Richard Niebuhr, offers this definition of "Liberalism": "A God without wrath brought men without sin into a Kingdom without judgment through the ministrations of a Christ without a Cross." Machen rightly maintained that "modern liberalism not only is a different religion from Christianity but belongs in a totally different class of religions." He continued:

Yet how great is the common heritage which unites the Roman Catholic Church, with its maintenance of the authority of Holy Scripture and with its acceptance of the great early creeds, to devout Protestants today! We would indeed not obscure the differences which divide us from Rome. The gulf is indeed profound. But profound as it is, it seems almost trifling compared to the abyss which stands between us and many ministers of our own Church. The Church of Rome may represent a perversion of the Christian religion; but naturalistic Liberalism is not Christianity at all.

That quote can just as well be spoken by a devout Catholic, merely switching "Protestant" and "Catholic."

We can appreciate the great good that we find in Christians outside the Catholic Church while, at the same time, deploring the "immense evil" of Luther's schism. We sincerely pray that all men may come to the fullness of the truth in Christ. To quote Cardinal Walter Brandmuller:

There is nothing that could be truer than the Catholic faith — and wherever the Catholic faith, Catholic truth and Catholic moral principles are put in action, the world, despite all human shortcomings, is put in order.


