FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The Protestant Reformation, 1517–2017

Preparations are under way to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation next year. As Catholics, we cannot "celebrate" something that caused the fracturing of Christendom and whole nations breaking away from the Catholic faith. We can, however, take advantage of this milestone to consider the progress made in ecumenical dialogue over the past few decades. Both Catholics and Protestants share some fundamental beliefs — what C. S. Lewis called "mere Christianity" — and it has been said that what unites us is greater than what separates us.

The primacy of the Bible as the inspired word of God indeed provides a solid foundation for discussion. However, a huge hurdle is the key Lutheran principle of *sola scriptura* — "the Bible only." The Catholic Church has always held that our faith is firmly established on "Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition." This principle was explained in the 5th century by Vincent of Lerins who used the phrase *quod ubique*, *quod semper*, *quod ab omnibus* — what has been believed everywhere, always and by everyone.

In the early decades of the Reformation many attempts were made to restore religious unity. One notable attempt was the Conference of Worms in 1557 in which the German Emperor brought Catholics and Lutherans together to work out an agreement on the basic matters of faith. St. Peter Canisius addressed the conference on behalf of the Catholic Church. What he said then, still holds today:

On one point we and the Lutherans are agreed, namely that we acknowledge the canonical Scriptures to be true, holy, internally consistent, and entirely divine, and of incomparable authority. Further, we hold that those Scriptures provide the best and soundest criterion for the adjustment of controversies in belief and religion. Whenever the Bible is clear and distinct in itself, we gladly submit to its testimony and ask for no other authority or evidence. But as soon as conflict arises about the meaning of an obscure passage and it is difficult to decide rival claims to the true meaning, then we appeal with perfect justice to the interpretation of the Fathers. This is not in order that the Church may teach us without reference to the Scriptures but that the Church may show us the true and orthodox sense of the Scriptures; not that our faith may rest upon human authority without any regard to the Divine Word, but that we may learn from the explanations and instructions of holy men what the Divine Word really says. Where the sense of Scripture is clear and unambiguous we do not appeal to the Church, but in doubtful places, we prefer the common agreement of the Church to the private opinions of changeable men.

Unless we can resolve the contradiction between the Protestant principle of *sola scriptura* versus Scripture-and-Tradition, can any real reconciliation be achieved?
