#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

*Life without faith* — *cracked cisterns.* 

It is perfectly easy to live without faith — to live as if God does not exist. Most of our family, friends and neighbors seem to live happy and fulfilling lives without taking the least interest in religion. Some claim to be atheists — God does not exist. Some claim to be agnostics — maybe he does or maybe he doesn't, but nobody can say for sure. Some claim to be spiritual but not religious. Some just never think about God at all.

The irreligious seem to get on in this world just as well and even better than the religious. Looking through the Old Testament, it is hard to see how God's "chosen people," the Israelites, were any better off than the Philistines. More often than not God was punishing the Israelites for their sins while the pagan idols — though mute stones — did as little harm as they did good. No doubt the pagans much preferred their own uninhibited fertility rites to the fasting and breastbeating of the Jewish *Yom Kippur*, the "Day of Atonement." What did Jesus promise his disciples other than the cross?

Not so long ago it was believed that religion was necessary for morality. Certainly, the Jewish religion was necessary for Jewish morality, and the Christian religion is necessary for Christian morality. But modern non-religion gets to make up its own morality. This is what Pope Benedict called the "dictatorship of relativism" — there is no absolute good or evil, except believing makes it so. Pope John Paul II called it the "culture of death." As the anti-hero of Milton's *Paradise Lost* said, "Evil, be thou my good."

There is another old-fashioned notion, that religion is somehow necessary for "salvation." St. Paul warned the Galatians against "fornication, impurity, licentiousness, ... and things like these. I am warning you, that those who do such things will not inherit the Kingdom of God."

But, if there isn't any God then there can't be any Kingdom. And if there *is* a God, then surely he is so loving and merciful that we don't have anything to worry about because everybody goes to heaven (if there is a heaven).

Most people today consider themselves to be good people. They are happy as they are. They have no need for God in their lives. They don't ask God for anything, and they don't owe God anything. They are comfortable.

God says through the prophet Jeremiah: "My people have forsaken me, the fountain of living water, and dug out cisterns for themselves, cracked cisterns that can hold no water."

There is nothing mysterious about faith. It is the simple recognition of reality — recognizing who God is and who we are in relation to God. Religion is nothing except the outward expression of our faith, our love of God.

Why should we love God? As the poet Gerard Manley Hopkins expressed it: "What must I love thee, Lord, for then? For being my king and God. Amen."
