## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

A Catholic Pope

For most Catholics their only understanding of the Church comes from attendance at Sunday Mass and what they get from the Mainstream Media. Regarding the media — TV and radio — the picture of the Catholic Church that is presented is more often than not simply bizarre. As a general rule, the media does not "get" religion so they consistently get the Catholic Church wrong. We see this constantly in their coverage of Pope Francis.

We are still adjusting to a new style of Pope. As we should expect, each Pope has his own particular personality, his own individual style.

For most adults, Pope John Paul II is the model of a modern Pope: a great intellect, articulate in half a dozen languages, genuinely prayerful, charismatic, deep in life experience and personally acquainted with suffering.

Pope Benedict, of course, was different in many ways. He was always the quiet professor of theology, a man of great personal humility but firm in proclaiming the Catholic faith. Benedict (then Cardinal Ratzinger) was Pope John Paul's "right hand man" for over twenty years and as his successor was an excellent "transition" Pope.

Pope Francis is something else entirely: a Jesuit, an Archbishop from South America, outspoken, free-wheeling. His election as Pope came as a total surprise. Of course, he was very well known by his fellow Cardinal electors, but for us he was an unknown quantity.

Impromptu, unscripted, off the cuff remarks — this is something we are not used to from Popes, but this is Pope Francis' style. Most people see this as refreshing. Here is a religious leader who is not afraid to simply speak his mind, straight from the heart, honestly and openly.

We have to get used to a Pope who is unpredictable. At the same time, we also have to put up with a mainstream media that is totally predictable. The media really cannot grasp the fact that religion is not politics — at least in the Catholic Church. Politicians run on a platform of "change," so naturally the media expects the same of a new Pope. The media is eager to seize on any casual comment of Pope Francis so that it can breathlessly announce that Pope Francis is about to change the Church's teaching on [fill in the blank]. Eventually, the media will get over it.

When Pope Benedict resigned and while we were wondering who would take his place, I wrote:

I do not know who the next Pope will be. But I know without a doubt that, whoever he is, he will faithfully preserve and expound the Catholic faith.

And this is what Pope Francis has been doing. Yes, he has a style that is all his own, but he also has substance: and that substance is his fidelity to the Catholic Faith. In this he is not different from his two predecessors. We need to keep in mind what the mainstream media simply does not yet get: the Pope is Catholic.
