

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Through a glass darkly.

There are some things that are, strictly speaking, unimaginable — we quite literally cannot form a mental image of them in our minds. For example, we know that the universe was created from "nothing," but it is impossible for us to have a mental image of nothingness. Or take the case of a man born blind: even though he may acquire a thorough scientific knowledge of the properties of light, it is impossible for him to have a mental image of the color red. We can only picture in our minds what we have first seen with our eyes. Or as St. Thomas Aquinas puts it: *nihil in intellectum nisi prius in sensu* — there can be nothing in the intellect unless it is first in the senses.

This is the difficulty that we face when we try to imagine God. Since we cannot grasp God with our senses — we cannot see him or hear him or touch him — it is not possible for us to have a true mental picture of him. This is true even for the loftiest theologians and the holiest saints. This impossibility of imagining God leads many people to doubt his existence, as if a blind man would doubt the existence of color.

There are many things that we can know about God and many things that we can say about him: that he exists; that he is all-knowing and all-powerful; that he created the universe and everything in it. But even though we can know all these things about God with certainty, still we cannot imagine him. We describe God as a spiritual being, but that is not strictly true. God is not "a being" at all — God is the *source* of all being. Even when we say "God exists," that is true only in the sense that God is the *source* of all existence. God cannot be put into any category.

How then can we see God? We are like poor blind Bartimaeus, standing in the crowd and crying out as Jesus is passing by. Jesus stops and calls him forward. "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus says: "I want to see." Jesus then gives him the power of sight, saying: "Go, your faith has made you well." This physical healing is only the symbol of a greater spiritual healing.

We "see" God through Faith — Faith is "a way of knowing." Faith is often represented as light or vision. In the familiar hymn we sing, "I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see." One spiritual writer referred to our connection with God as a "cloud of unknowing," an intimate and sure knowledge of God, but without any distinct images.

How does one describe the certainty of faith? On the one hand it is absolutely certain — there is not the least doubt. But on the other hand, there is also an inevitable obscurity: God, in his very nature, transcends all human thought and imagination. In this world, we walk by faith and not by sight. "For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known."
