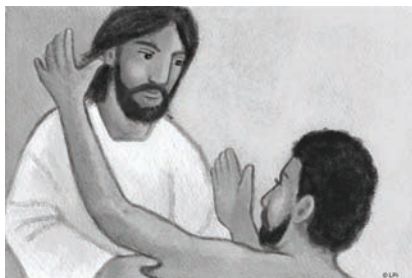

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Let nothing disturb you; let nothing frighten you.

All things are passing; God never changes.

Patient endurance obtains all things.

Whoever has God lacks nothing.

God alone suffices. — St. Teresa’s Bookmark

In honor of the feast day of St. Teresa of Avila I read a short biography written by her best translator, E. Allison Peers. It reminded me why I love St. Teresa so much.

To read St. Teresa is to know her as a friend. Her books were written for the nuns of her convent and for her other close friends. The warmth of her affection for them radiates from the pages. Although she speaks of the heights of prayer, she always keeps in mind us beginners in the spiritual life. Her greatest concern is for those who have just “begun to serve God,” for she knows the trials that are faced by those who are determined to make a beginning in prayer.

It always amazes me that there are Catholics who do not know St. Teresa of Avila! Her spiritual autobiography is one of the greatest books of all time. I read it decades ago simply as a classic of world literature. Along with the *Confessions* of St. Augustine and *The Imitation of Christ*, it is essential Catholic reading.

It is an excellent thing to read the Bible — and we should all do more of it — but you cannot know the riches of the Catholic faith if you are unacquainted with our greatest Saints. As Pope Benedict XVI said, since the Bible was inspired by the Holy Spirit, the best interpreters of the Bible are those who are most alive in that same Spirit, the Saints. St. Teresa has the rare distinction of being named a *Doctor* (i.e., a “teacher”) of the Church.

St. Teresa was born in 1515, just before the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. To use a biblical image, Luther and Calvin all the rest of the reformers together “weigh less than rust on the scales” in comparison with her. I have often thought that if there ever came a time when my faith began to waver, all I would need to do is go back to St. Teresa. It might be possible for me to doubt my own faith, it is absolutely impossible to doubt hers.

Putting her biography back onto the bookshelf, I can’t help asking: “When am I going to begin to serve God?” Up till now it seems that I have hardly made a start. Still, St. Teresa provides encouragement:

Have great confidence, for it is necessary not to hold back one’s desires. God is a friend of courageous souls if they walk in humility and without trusting in self. I marvel at how important it is to be courageous in striving for great things along this path of prayer. For although the soul is not yet strong enough, it nonetheless takes flight and goes very high, even if, like a little fledgling, it soon tires and stops. I often thought that St. Peter did not lose anything when he threw himself into the sea, even though afterward he became frightened. These first acts of determination are very important.

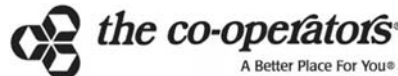
