FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The courage of our convictions.

I recently watched an episode of a travel show, "Anthony Bourdain: Parts Unknown," in which Bourdain visits Hanoi, North Vietnam. In this show we meet some wonderful people getting by with little economic wealth but who still find genuine joy in the simple things of life. It was good to see. There was, however, one thing about the show that annoyed me. The question kept coming up: "Why was America at war with such wonderful people, whom we can now meet around a restaurant table as friends?"

Of course, the U.S. was never at war with the *people* of North Vietnam; the U.S. was at war with the Communist ideology, of which the good people of North Vietnam were the first victims. In the same way, in World War II, the enemy was not the people of Germany, or the people of Japan — the enemy was Nazism and Japanese Imperialism. Germany and Japan are now respected and trusted allies. Similarly, Russia was not the enemy in the Cold War — the Soviet Union was an "evil empire," but with the fall of the Soviet totalitarian system, hostility came to an abrupt end. We should not make the mistake of identifying a people with the ideologies that are imposed upon them.

The political philosopher Friedrich Hayek, wrote in the 1940's, in the midst of the Second World War:

If we are to succeed in the war of ideologies and to win over the decent elements in the enemy countries, we must, first of all, regain belief in the traditional values for which we have stood in the past and must have the moral courage to defend the ideas which our enemies attack. Not by shamefaced apologies and by assurances that we are rapidly reforming, not by explaining that we are seeking some compromise between the traditional liberal values and the new totalitarian ideas, shall we win confidence and support. Not the latest improvements we may have effected in our social institutions, which count but little compared with the basic differences of two opposed ways of life, but our unwavering faith in these traditions which made England and America countries of free and upright, tolerant and independent, people in the things that count.

Cardinal Brandmuller has more recently written in a similar vein about the current clash of ideologies:

We should finally stop being like the frightened rabbit that stares at the snake before being swallowed by it. This defeatist attitude, this whining self-pity that has gained so much ground in Catholic circles, is an insult to God. What is needed is a new, forceful consciousness of being Catholic. There is nothing that could be truer than the Catholic faith — and wherever the Catholic faith, Catholic truth and Catholic moral principles are put in action, the world, despite all human shortcomings, is put in order.

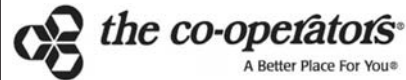
