### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Begin Again

The coming year, 2017, is going to be busy with commemorations of many historical events.

On July 5<sup>th</sup>, our parish will celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of the new St. Paul's Church. The Catholic Church will commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the apparitions of our Blessed Mother at Fatima; and we will have occasion to recall her message to the three shepherd children, a message that contained both words of warning and hope for the future.

As a nation we will celebrate 150 years of Confederation. I vividly remember the excitement of the Centennial; my family was living in Montreal at the time. As Canadians we will also remember the sacrifice made by previous generations to preserve our freedoms as we observe the centenaries of the First World War battles of Vimy Ridge and Passchendale.

The year 2017 will also mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Communist Revolution in Russia and the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of the Protestant Reformation.

It is said that you can only connect the dots by looking backward. There is much for us to look back on, especially over the last fifty years. The year 1967 has been referred to as "the last good year." For the Catholic faithful, it was a time of rapid transition from the "pre-Vatican II" Church to the "post-Vatican II" Church. We are still in the process of recovering from the turmoil of that transition. We have come to realize that many of the changes which were embraced with such great enthusiasm at the time have failed to produce positive results. We should not be afraid to admit mistakes and be prepared to correct them.

Given the present as our starting point, how do we now proceed? The question is, as Fr. Benedict Groeschel used to say, "What is the next best step?"

St. Teresa of Avila said: "The most we have to strive for in the beginning is to care for oneself alone and consider that there is nothing on earth but God and oneself — and this practice is very beneficial." Any good that we do must start with developing our own relationship with God through prayer and meditation, through the Sacraments, and by reading good books. We start first with ourselves and then reach out to others.

What's past is prologue. The past has brought us to this point in time, but it is for us to determine where the future will lead. The motto of Venerable Bruno Lanteri was *Nunc coepi* — "Now I begin", or as it is also translated, "Begin again." Despite many disappointments in his priestly career — at one point the religious order of priests that he had founded was forced to disperse — Fr. Lanteri was always able to pick himself up, brush himself off and start all over again. After the greatest disappointments, even upon seeing the apparent failure of all his efforts, he would merely say: "Nunc coepi — Now I begin."
