FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Wings

During the summer, the Parish naturally slows down. This provides an opportunity to catch up on things that have been put off for lack of time.

One of the backlog items has been the Pastoral Plan. Earlier this year the Archdiocese sent out a questionnaire asking how the implementation of the plan was coming along. I didn't respond to it because I was busy with too many other things at the time. I put it on the shelf, intending to work on it during the summer. Of course half of the things that I had planned to do during the summer never got done, including looking again at the Pastoral Plan. It was a question of priorities and of available time.

And yet ... The Pastoral Plan is not supposed to add to our work. It is not about doing *more*, but of doing *better*. As the saying goes: "Don't work harder; work smarter." Still, it is difficult to find the breathing space in the midst of the daily busyness to change the way we do things, even knowing that it will result in reducing our busyness and freeing up more time to spend on what is most important.

When I was working as an engineer, I was proud of how well organized I was — a place for everything and everything in its place. I had a filing system and detailed schedules and deadlines for each project. I thought that I was an organized person, but in fact as a naturally *unorganized* person, I needed to impose order. The attention to filing and scheduling did not add additional work to my already busy day — it was the only way that I could get the work done.

St. Augustine once said: "Look after order, and order will look after you." We need order and structure in our lives. And that applies to our spiritual lives as well.

We are all busy, and it is easy to say, "I don't have time for God. Ideally, I would like to be an active Christian, a true disciple, but I can't add any more things to my already full schedule." But discipleship is not about how much we do, but how we do it. It is not an additional burden, but a way to lighten our burden. St. Paul says, "Put on Christ!" Is Christ a burden? No. Christ bears our burdens. The key is: "Don't work harder, work holier." We can try to get things done by our own power, or we can get things done by the power of the Holy Spirit. Only, we might find that once the Holy Spirit is involved, our priorities change, but always for the better.

St. Augustine uses a parable from nature:

Observe the case of birds. Every bird carries its wings: notice how they fold their wings when they come down to earth to rest, and how after a certain fashion they place them on their sides. Do you consider they are burdened by them? Let them remove the burden, they will fall. The less a bird has carried that load, so much the less has it flown. How can you be capable of carrying your burdens, unless God, being carried, carries you?
