FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Walking in the light

In his famous poem, *Dover Beach*, Matthew Arnold in 1867 imagined the "sea of faith" receding from the continent of Europe just as the ocean tide recedes from the shore. It is a sad, but accurate image, as we see Europe now almost completely secular and Canada trailing not far behind. We are indeed now in what Cardinal Newman also foresaw as an "age of irreligion."

Virgil, the great Latin poet, said "Felix, qui potuit rerum cognoscere causas — Happy the man who knows the causes of things." Both Arnold and Newman, writing at the same time but from very different viewpoints, could see what was happening before their eyes and predict what was likely to come, but they could offer no insight into the causes. Certainly, the "enlightenment" philosophies of Descartes, Kant, Hegel etc. offered a new way of looking at the world that exalted "pure reason" and shunted God aside. But these philosophers are a symptom rather than a cause. Although the fundamental flaws of their systems are now universally acknowledged, modern philosophy has simply moved on to systems of even greater incoherence.

As in the laws of physics, order naturally resolves into chaos, i.e., things fall apart. In the same way we humans naturally incline to follow the broad and easy downward path, though it leads to destruction. When we read the story of the people of Israel in the Old Testament, we see that God's chosen people often fell to worshiping the false gods of the Canaanites. It is only when disaster struck that they began to listen to the words of the prophets and to turn their hearts back to the one true God.

We know that true religion, as opposed to merely religious sentiment, presents a serious challenge. It is the narrow gate and the uphill climb. It does not pander to our lower natures but calls us to live according to our higher nature as children of God and disciples of Christ. Pope Benedict expressed this in his advice to young people: "You were not made for mediocrity, You were created for greatness." So why do so many choose mediocrity?

Fr. Basil Maturin, a contemporary of Arnold and Newman, wrote: "To know God is to know yourself. To have no knowledge of God is to walk in darkness, to have no standard by which to gauge and measure yourself. Those who shut God out of their lives are able to live in stupid if not happy ignorance of what failures their lives are." These are harsh sounding words but they contain a deep truth.

We have a purpose in life, which is "to know and serve God here on earth, and after, to see and enjoy Him forever in Heaven." Not to fulfill that purpose is indeed to make a failure of our lives. St. Augustine expresses the same truth in different words: "This is all that evil is: a soul that will not enter into the covenant this its God." We are all invited into a special relationship with God. Why would anyone refuse that invitation?
