
St. Paul the Apostle and Immaculate Conception Churches

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Every vocation is a religious vocation.

At weddings it is common to hear St. Paul's tribute to love: "Now theses three remain: faith, hope and love, and the greatest of these is love." However, the Greek word that St. Paul uses is not *eros*, the love of bride and groom, but *agape*, the love of God and neighbor. Far from being a celebration of marital love, it is a reminder that any love that is not founded on love of God has no solid foundation.

We need to keep in mind that *every vocation is a religious vocation*. This includes especially the vocation to marriage and family, since this is the vocation to which most of God's people feel called.

I have often heard it said that prior to the Second Vatican Council it was believed that only priests, monks or nuns could be "holy." One of the great themes of Vatican II was "the universal call to holiness." This was hailed as a declaration of liberty: the vast majority of God's people no longer had to settle for second-class-citizen status in the Church — everyone could now be holy!

Rather than being a reason for celebration — as if haloes would now be handed out automatically along with the marriage certificate — this should have been a reason for "fear and trembling." It meant that being married could no longer be used as an excuse for *not* being holy. One could no longer rely on the principle of division of labor: let the priests and nuns look after being holy, while everyone else could get on with "real" life. Parents were no longer off the hook. It was no longer sufficient to muddle through with the absolute minimum of commitment.

As Pope John Paul II has said: we are all — without exception — called to the "the high standard of ordinary Christian living." We are all called to become saints, each in his own vocation, but *every* vocation is a *religious* vocation.

If we think of holiness principally as a life of prayer, then monks and nuns have an advantage, since prayer is their main occupation. But holiness is also sacrifice. And in that regard, parents have opportunities for advancing in holiness that monks can only dream of.

Each of us has a vocation, a state of life to which we are called. For each of us, our vocation is the principal means of becoming holy. All of us have a vocation to sainthood. It is for this reason that we have been put upon this earth. At the end of one's life the only sadness is not having been a saint.

It is said that people with "real" lives don't have the time for prayer. Make time! A wise old friend once told me: always make sure you pray at least fifteen minutes a day. The only time that you can make an exception to this rule is if you are busy — in which case, you must pray for half an hour! It is when we are busy that we most need prayer. Prayer is not an extra burden, but the most effective means of bearing our burdens. This applies especially to the Mass, because the Eucharist is the ultimate prayer — the first and indispensable support of the Christian life.
