### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Faith and reason — two wings of the spirit

During my visit to the high school last week, I was asked by one of the students whether there was anything in the Catholic faith that I disagreed with. I answered by quoting Cardinal Brandmuller: "There is nothing truer than the Catholic faith."

In a way it is a strange question. It is like asking, "Is there anything in geometry that you disagree with?" Now, there are some things about geometry that I may not fully understand or that I might have difficulty explaining, but I have no doubt that geometry can be understood and explained, by others if not by myself.

The Catholic faith likewise is capable of being understood and explained. One of the great things about St. Thomas Aquinas is that he recognizes that theology (the study of that which pertains to God), like geometry, is an intellectual discipline. Denys Turner notes in his biography:

Thomas says that theology is a true discipline: it has a teachable curriculum; it requires training in specific skills you can acquire and carry about with you; it covers a defined range of issues and tenets that are studied over a fixed period; it carries a standard bibliography of authorities; and you can examine students so as to test how good they are at it. You can pass or fail them.

How often is religion described as *feeling* rather than *thinking*? Pope St. Pius X described the modern conception of faith as "an intuition of the heart which puts man in immediate contact with the *reality* of God, and infuses a persuasion of God's existence that far exceeds any scientific conviction." But he continues: "How far this position is removed from Catholic teaching! What is to prevent such religious experiences from being found in any religion?"

Cardinal Newman had absolutely no use for religion as a feeling or sentiment: "Dogma has been the fundamental principle of my religion: I know no other religion; I cannot enter into the idea of any other sort of religion; religion as a mere *sentiment*, is to me a dream and a mockery."

Faith is not *feeling* — faith is an act of the *intellect* and the *will*. And if in this life our knowledge must remain partial and incomplete it is by no means less certain. As St. Paul wrote to the Romans:

Ever since the creation of the world God's eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things he has made. So they are without excuse; for though they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their senseless minds were darkened. Claiming to be wise, they became fools.

For the Catholic, "faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth." In the end, truth is all that matters, and nothing can be truer than the Catholic faith.
