FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

And in the vision, I saw ...

In the movie *Heaven is Real*, four year old Colton has an experience of visiting heaven. The movie doesn't focus much on the experience itself, but more on how the family and the community deal with it. Is it a hoax? Is this something the boy imagined? Or did it really happen?

The situation is complicated because the father is an Evangelical minister. Of course, for us Catholics, it is hard to see what all the fuss is about. Visions happen all the time. Some are notable — like those of Catherine of Genoa or Julian of Norwich —but most are simply run-of-the-mill.

St. Brendan had a vision of heaven: "I was in this Church on this day seven years ago, when I was caught up to heaven and heard the singing of the angels. After listening to that music, the music of this world is to me no better than the scraping of fingernails on a blackboard."

If you look in the Bible, there are many accounts of visions: Ezekiel in the valley of the dry bones or the entire Book of Revelation. Did the things experienced by Ezekiel or John in these visions really happen? We can say that the experience was real, but it was the experience of a vision.

It is hard to get excited about visions. Colton visited heaven? Wonderful! And Jesus had a horse? Excellent! It's a nice vision, but you can't say much more about it.

In the movie, however, the parents have a very difficult time coming to grips with it. Visions are just not the type of thing that happens to good Evangelical Protestants.

The turning point in the story comes when Colton casually mentions to his mother that he has a sister. Well, of course he has a sister. No, he means *another* sister, one he met in heaven and who kept hugging him. So his mother asks, what is her name. Colton says, she doesn't have a name, you never gave her one.

This was a baby sister who died by miscarriage before she was born — but Colton had no way of knowing about it.

Where do babies go who die before birth? According to this little boy who visited there, they go to heaven. The souls of countless children — those who never saw the light of day either because of natural miscarriage or, more tragically, because their lives were cut short by abortion.

Theologically, I suppose it is not possible to be sad in heaven, for heaven is pure joy. Yet, we honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus — a heart that even now sorrows on our account. And can a mother, even in heaven, not grieve when she sees her children in distress? Somehow, joy does not cancel out sadness. Can both joy and sadness exist together in the same heart, undiminished, even in heaven?

Of all the many things that Colton saw in heaven the one thing that sticks with me is this: meeting his unborn sister — nameless. And I can't help thinking how sad it must be, even in heaven, not to have a name.

Next Sunday we will take part in Life Chain and remember all the nameless children. Be there with us.
