

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

The heresy of formlessness.

Twelve years ago, Pope Benedict XVI issued the document *Summorum Pontificum* in which he declared that all Roman Catholic priests are free to celebrate the Traditional Latin Mass. The institution of the new form of Mass following the Second Vatican Council by Pope Paul VI did not invalidate the previous form.

The arguments against the celebration of the Traditional Latin Mass remind me of a disagreement between St. Augustine and St. Jerome concerning the observance of the rites of the Old Testament. Augustine thought that these rites had indeed been superseded but there was little harm for Jewish converts to continue to observe them. Jerome thought that they were entirely forbidden: they were not only 'dead' but 'deadly.'

There is many a modern Jerome who considers the Traditional Latin Mass in the same way, as positively toxic. But as Pope Benedict explained: "What earlier generations held as sacred, remains sacred and great for us too, and it cannot be all of a sudden entirely forbidden or even considered harmful. It is incumbent on all of us to preserve the riches which have developed in the Church's faith and prayer, and to give them their proper place."

The guiding principle of the reform of the Mass in the 1960s was a return to "the original norms and rites of the Fathers." As interpreted by the celebrated liturgist Josef Jungmann this meant: "Certain prayers of the Roman liturgy which are no older than the Carolingian era [i.e., 9th century] would really all have to vanish. At a minimum, in order that any of these prayers be retained, a justifying reason must, in each single case, be found."

For a long time this puzzled me. If the goal of the reform of the Mass was to eliminate 'late additions' and 'accretions' and return to the ancient form of celebration of the early Church, how did we end up with so many *new* additions and accretions, not least of which are several brand new Eucharistic Prayers?

The answer is this. By the time of St. Gregory the Great in the 6th century, the essentials of the Mass are already set. We also see clear indications of the same form of the Mass two centuries earlier in the homilies of St. Augustine. But if we go all the way back to St. Justin Martyr in the 2nd century, the form of the Mass is much less clear. In fact, when Justin describes the Eucharistic Prayer he says, "The bread and wine and water are brought, and the presider offers prayers and thanksgivings, according to his ability and the people assent, saying *Amen*."

Here, according to the liturgists, is the authentic Mass of the early Church, where there are no set texts and the priest simply prays *ex tempore* as the Spirit moves him. It turns out that, in spite of two millennia of liturgical forms, the true form is no form at all. That is what Martin Mosebach has called the 'heresy of formlessness.'
