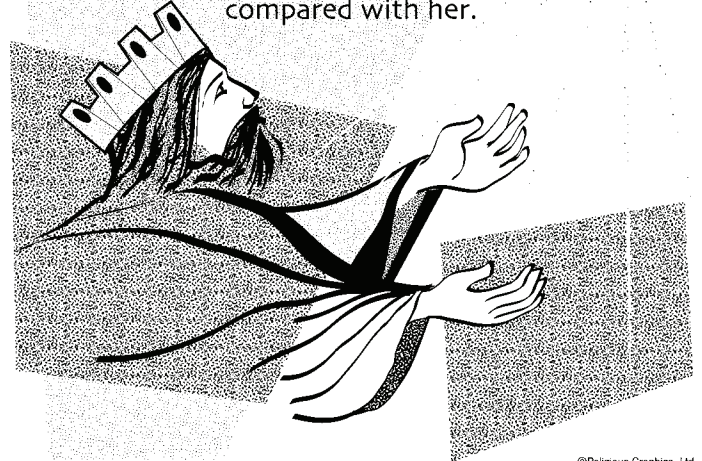

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY CATCH18 PROJECT

Did you know?

1. Once a family becomes a Habitat Home owner, there is a 60% reduction in food bank usage.
2. 37% of new Habitat Home Owners were in social housing before they became Habitat Home Owners.
3. 22% of the children in these Habitat families went on to receive a full college education, versus 8% in the control group.
4. 50% of the Habitat families are physically active, versus the national average of 15%.
5. 100% of all the funds raised by CATCH18 goes directly to the Burlington Crew-Goetz Project. All of Habitat's infrastructure funding comes from government, and from their Re-vive and Re-Store operations.
6. You can receive a Tax Receipt for your donation; cheques should be made out to Habitat for Humanity, Halton/Mississauga, noting that it is to be credited to the account of CATCH18.
