

Ruminations

I remember seeing a novelty note pad with the title on the top of the page that called it a "tuit" list. This was supposed to be a list of things that you promised yourself that you would get 'tuit' or 'to it.' Along with my obsession with numbers, I think the making of lists goes hand in hand. So I promised myself that this wonderful reprieve from the daily grind of meetings, and visits and the myriad other activities that make up my days, I would make them productive. In that way, whenever this isolation ends I can look back at a whole series of completed tasks that themselves have hung around my neck like an albatross and more often than not elicited a "If only I had the time!" Well, thanks to the virus that caused the restrictions, I do have the time. Now I have also refrained from turning on the television before Jeopardy, and even the radio has remained silent. I don't mind the silence one bit, but a huge building like the church sometimes seems alive with creaks and cracks in the walls, and pews and roof. So I sit and marvel at the plans I have made but will not venture to tackle. As much as there is a probability that I might be able to do them, the greater probability is that they will end up being a repairman's project and I will be the subject of repairmen's legends of the priest who thought he could but... Alas. I did plant some seeds for summer planting, and I am proud if not astonished to report that my green beans, tomatoes, arugula, broccoli and spinach have all sprouted and are growing like weeds. Now so long as I don't kill them before I can plant them outside properly in a month or so, I should be reaping my first


