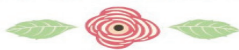

Ruminations

I am a little vague on the day of my first communion. Being an advanced child, the occasion took place when I was in grade 1. The truth be known, that was when we celebrated last millennium. Our school, the old St. Mary's in Bradford was literally a hundred yards from the church and so every first Friday we had to climb the stairs beside the grade 6 classroom and march up the road in single file and absolute silence. It was a trick of those nuns, ninja experts with the yardstick or pointer, to keep us in line. I remember on one of the first Fridays that we were in attendance, and it must have been close to our May first communion, it came time for the communion procession. One of the young grade one's who shall remain nameless, not because I have forgotten his name, but because his mother and father are known to many in the parish, stepped out to join the line processing forward. Anyway, as one not to be outdone, I talked with my cousin who was sitting beside me that if he can do it, so can we, so the two of us stepped out of the pew and joined in the line to the front of the church. Back in the day, the front of the church was rather forbidden territory for young ones. It was gated, there was no such thing as offering a blessing to those who are not receiving communion, and so therefore, we had never gone closer to the altar than our pew. I suppose I was a bit nervous, thinking that I was part of some secret plot, or we were on some great "Lord of the Rings" adventure. Step by step my cousin and I approached the communion rail at any time expecting the long arm of the teacher to haul us back, or worse, the nun with her precision weapon, the yardstick to intervene. As the line processed closer and closer to communion, I remember a bit of a panic setting in. I didn't know what to do, or how to receive. We hadn't yet covered that aspect of first communion, and since we had never approached the altar to witness either of my parents receiving as it was not the custom, I was sure I would be found out by the priest. To dart or not to dart, that was the question. I whispered to my cousin if he knew what to do, but he didn't either. Just as I figured all was lost, I felt a hand on my shoulder saying "what do you think you are doing, mister?" As I turned, I saw my aunt kneeling in the pew a few seats from the front. She had already hauled the student who shall remain nameless into the pew with

her, and now my cousin and I were hauled in beside him. I don't remember too much trouble, but I do remember a stern conversation when I got home. So on May 7, 1967, I with all the other grade 1's celebrated our first communion on a bleak, cold spring morning. And the rest as they say is history.

The closing prayer service was an atmosphere of prayerful reflection...with candles illuminating the altar, soft music... the carrying of the cross by four high school youth and the washing of the candidates' feet by our group leaders ... thank you to everyone... all the candidates and their parents, Fr. Roy and all the adult and youth ministers ... for making this retreat experience so very special! We are all **'called by name to be the light of Christ in the world.'**

Confirmation Small Groups All our small groups are underway. Candidates be sure not to miss any meetings. If you do not have a **sponsor**, now is the time to ask someone to be your confirmation sponsor. *"A sponsor is a person who encourages and assists a candidate to embrace and actively practice the Catholic faith both before and after Confirmation. The sponsor must be an active, practicing Catholic who can be a role model for you...either male or female, a person who regularly attends Sunday Mass, must be a fully initiated Catholic, 16 years of age or older and may not be the parent of the candidate"*

All our candidates for Confirmation are expected to be sharing in the celebration of Sunday Mass (every Sunday) and taking time to reflect on the Gospel and how it relates to their life. This is a most important part of their preparation for Confirmation... *living our Catholic way of life.*
