

#### **Ruminations...**

The mad rush began with the heavy snowfall on the Friday before Palm Sunday. It must have been a very heavy snowfall, because eight of our juniper trees were not just bent over, they were actually up-rooted, pulled out of the ground. Anyone who noticed them recognized what an eye sore they were, and a week before Easter of all times, when we want to put our best foot forward. It was time to call out the forest rangers who hammered and dug and pushed and groaned trying to right the trees so they could be staked and tied up for a temporary respectable presentation. They must come down soon though. Then there was the logistical nightmare of trying to find or create change rooms for 23 people to be baptized. Finding and creating pre-baptism gowns and post baptism gowns was tantamount to putting on a Parish fashion show. Then there was the choreography team of trying to gracefully line them all up, process them to and from the font, give them their new garment, light their baptism candles, hustle them to the change rooms and have them back in time for their confirmation - all within the time frame of the rest of the congregation finishing coming to the water and the choir ending their song. It was kind of like liturgical musical pews. Luckily no one drowned or was stepped on. And despite complaints to the contrary, the water was not that cold. The vigil had a rough start - the Paschal candle would not stay lit, so unknown to most of the people, in the darkness of the procession in from the fire, it was clandestinely switched out for last year's candle and the wick fixed for the morning masses, and yes, even so, the baptisms and lighting of the baptism candles remain valid. I'm not sure if we all realize just how much work is done over the scope of the Triduum. There are the obvious people, the ministers like lectors, hospitality, Eucharistic ministers, altar servers, and of course the music ministry. But there is also a ton of work that goes on behind the scenes, lining up and instructing the cross bearers, the gift bearers, the children bringing up the props during the passion narrative. There were the towel washers, the pitcher fillers, the decorators, the waterers, the font fillers, the last minute detailers, the setter uppers, and the list goes on. If we were to tally all the hours of work and preparation, it would literally be in the thousands. The RCIA have been preparing for that evening for over a year. The combined music ministries had prepared for months, scheduling began before Lent, decoration conversations began shortly after last Easter. It is all a profound act of faith, and though most people spend their hour on



Easter morning at Mass, it is only as prayerful and wonderful a celebration because so many have offered their time and talents. We owe them a huge appreciation that we could worthily worship and praise our God. He is risen indeed. Alleluia, alleluia. Thank you all. Bring on First Communions.
