Ruminations...

I never had a key to our house growing up. In fact, neither did any of my brothers, nor did mom or dad. Although the front door did have the potential to lock. There was never any key that I could think of. Even when we would go away for hockey tournaments, vacations, or even to drop me off at university, the door was always left unlocked, and there was never any problem. We would joke about our neighbour who was her own version of 'Neighbourhood Watch', that she would be sure to catch any untoward people trying to break in. It wasn't until I was in the seminary that the door handle was replaced so that the house could be secured. Once, when I got a new bike for my birthday, it went missing from being parked on the front lawn. A quick drive around the neighbourhood located it hidden under the bridge and so I started parking it around the back of the house in the basement. Entering high school was the first formal acquaintance with locks. We purchased a combination lock for my locker, and as with most grade nines, it was such an exciting event that we shared our combination with so many people that the lock was more of a decoration than a deterrent. I can still remember that combination, 8-50-2. Growing up in a somewhat keyless world, it was novel and cloak and dagger to lock things up. Oh how times have changed. In Ajax, the rectory was broken into once. It was a few weeks after I received my graduation ring from the University of Notre Dame. Not being a jewelry buff, I felt a bit ostentatious wearing it and since I was travelling to the States for a conference, I decided to leave it at home. Low and behold, that was the time of the break in and the ring was gone. I was a bit sad, but not too much. I don't think I would ever have felt comfortable wearing it anyway. Well, this past weekend the rectory was robbed. Sometime during the 9:30 mass, someone entered the rectory, went upstairs to the bedrooms and made away with some money. It was a large jar of loose coins that had been amassing for almost five years. The exact amount is unknown but we guestimate between \$400 to \$500 - maybe more, maybe less. strictly a cash grab. Nothing else was taken. It's not so much the cash, but the violation of trust and security that it evokes. It is an utter lack of respect for fellow human beings. It reminds me of the true story of missionaries touring Japan and going into the Atomic Bomb Museum and needing to leave their cameras outside on the sidewalk. The guide assured them that the cameras would be there a couple of hours later,



and sure enough they were. In a 'non-Christian' country there is more respect for people and their possessions that in a so called 'Christian rooted' society. Go figure. So if the Church and Rectory seem more like Fort Knox now, you will understand why. At least the dirty socks and underwear were off the floor.
