

Ruminations...

I have told my story about my introduction into liturgy, not the cursory token approach at the seminary, but the encounter with the rich, profound, exciting treasury of the Church. It was with the first pastor who was charged with mentoring me through my first years as a young To make a long story short, a group called the Liturgical priest. Education Committee was presenting an eight week course and our parish was hosting it. Naively, being fresh out of the seminary, I erroneously assumed that I had been adequately formed in a strong liturgical spirituality - after all, isn't that the primary means by which a priestly ministry is exercised? Anyway, that wise pastor, who must have shaken his head wondering what was coming out of the seminary, said, "Try it, you may like it". Actually he suggested I go to the first one and if I didn't like it... well let's just confess that in the first 15 minutes of the presentation, I had learned more about liturgy than if five years of realized how inadequate our training had been, and seminary life. how cheated we as priests were, and ergo, how cheated the People of God are. Anyway, I was hooked. It led me to Ottawa and eventually to the University of Notre Dame, yes the home of the Fighting Irish. Once one gets involved in the Liturgical realm, one notices how small the circle is. The great revelation of receiving my Masters' Degree in Liturgy was really how little I know about liturgy, and how much more there is to explore. There have been some absolute giants that mesmerize and inspire me, and whom I could listen to for hours. Some of my most intimidating presentations across the country have been in the presence of these people. No legitimate liturgist ever considers themselves an expert, just an avid and keen student of the liturgy, but most of us hack liturgists pale in comparison. One such presentation was when I was invited to lead a workshop for the Archdiocese of Ottawa. I had only National Liturgy Director but I had never met him. As I heard of the scanned those in attendance, there at the back of the seats was himself. Now there was a presentation I was delivering in Sudbury once, and just as I began, the fire alarm went and we had to evacuate the premises. I started praying hard that the same fate would befall me now. At least I would have had time to gear myself up so that I wouldn't sound like a complete idiot. One thing I remember from that experience, as I looked out over the crowd was that not once did I ever glance his way or make eye contact. Anyway, I have gone on to hear him speak and teach and converse, and in my humble estimation, there is no one in Canada that has a finger on the pulse of who we are as Church. He often talks of thin places, where the separation between heaven and earth is very thin. When you hear him, he brings that heavenly realm very close. It is such a privilege to be gifted to hear authentic Church – and these



opportunities are few and far between. His name is Fr. Bill Burke and so do yourself a favour, do your faith a favour, come be inspired to encounter the living God.
