

Ruminations

On Facebook there was a frame asking what happened to June and July, they just seemed to fly by. Already there are signs and sales heralding the coming of the new school year. The days are getting markedly shorter by about two minutes every day, and the most brilliant of summer blossoms have seen better days. Hallmark has already displayed their Christmas ornaments, and I must confess that I have purchased this year's treasures. But perhaps the most telling and unsettling of signs of the nearing end of the summer is the opening of the Canadian National Exhibition. For whatever reason, the summer seems to be setting whenever the CNE opens, which it does this Friday. The first time I went there by myself, regional transportation, the new direct GO Bus to the CNE grounds alleviated the hassle of trying to take the bus and then the subway. As I entered the grounds, representatives from CHUM radio greeted me with a CHUM pin. I didn't have the heart to tell them I listened to a different station. As I began to wonder around looking at the pavilions, especially the farming shows, and the judo competition, I was stopped again by other reps from CHUM who questioned me about the button I was wearing and then they presented me with a t-shirt which didn't fit, and a three record set of the best of the Supremes which I still have. At the time I had no idea who the Supremes were but no matter, free is always good. Then I stumbled upon the sports camp there, ParticipAction was in its infancy and I spent the rest of the day playing volleyball before going into the good old grandstands for a Beach Boys' concert. It was such a feeling of independence and power to make that journey to the big city. Back in the day, trips to Toronto were rare, one, because it was so inconvenient, and two, because there were so few things that appealed to me. And that still holds true. I remember going into Toronto for a big event and the crowds and confusion were to overwhelming and busy that if I never made it there again, I could very easily die happy. I do have to confess though, my all-time favorite event was the midway waffle ice cream sandwich. I have had them elsewhere since, but none have ever compared to the deliciousness of munching on one of them under the warm August sunshine with the carnival atmosphere for a backdrop. For whatever reason, it just epitomized that summer feeling, and with Beach Boys' music ringing out "Good Vibrations" it was great to be there and a great way to mark the end of the summer in anticipation of hitting the books again. It has been years, maybe even over a decade or more

since I last attended. Concerts at the best of times do not appeal to me, and since the Grandstand is no more, something has been lost, but the opening of the CNE also unleashes a flood of innocent, and joyful reminiscences replete with great memories of delicious food samples, ice cream waffles and summer time music. Happy end of the summer.
