She was one of these people who would start dropping hints months before Christmas. Now when I say 'dropping hints', that translates into telling us exactly what she wanted and where we could get it. The boys, including dad, always offered to go together to buy her a dishwasher but she always refused the offer to the bewilderment and disappointment of us all. When all of us were finally out of the house, it was then that mom requested and then got, (mom seemed to always get what she wanted), a new dishwasher. The easiest years were when she wanted to start her special dishes collection. I guess once we were old enough to handle good china she was ready. Mom always loved the 'Old Country Rose' Royal Albert pattern. As luck would have it, Sears in the mall used to sell them by the place setting. So for a couple of years mom would receive a couple of settings. It took several years but I still remember the excite and pride she had the first Christmas dinner in which we were able to sit down at the dinner table with a brand new tablecloth that highlighted the new china settings. Even after it was still kind of easy to buy a gift for her because mom then moved onto the accessory pieces until the collection was full in her mind. I remember the year mom asked for a Nintendo play station. None of us could believe it, but of course that is exactly what she received under the tree. She struggled with the Legend of Zelda but then she developed a great friendship with the paperboy who would deliver the Toronto Star each day. He would help her out by telling her where to find weapons and potions and how to defeat the monsters. It took months and months, but mom eventually made her way through it all with a great sense of accomplishment and satisfaction. Looking back, those were fun Christmas mornings. I am now the guardian of mom's china set awaiting the time when it can be handed down to one of the grandchildren of my choice. It is kind of a little power that I wield over them. If I need some chores done, or help with various things, I play the you are my favorite and grandma's china could be yours someday if you..' cut the grass, or water the gardens, or help me set up the nativities. You get the idea. But I know what gift made mom the happiest. It wasn't anything the children gave, it was a gift one Christmas when my dad had arranged without my mom knowing, to receive the sacrament of reconciliation, back when people wouldn't go unless they had confessed. Dad had not been to communion for a long, long time so that Christmas morning when dad joined mom in line, she came back to the pew with tears of joy in her eyes. It was never publicly discussed, but we all knew




