It has been a couple of weeks since our proverbial groundhog anticipated the arrival of Spring. Since then, we have been dumped with a month's worth of snow, rained and iced on, and seen very little of that giant yellow orb we call the sun. Yet as I walk into almost any store, it seems winter is non-existent. The large hardware stores are crowded by the displays of patio furniture and screened in gazebo, vegetable and flower seeds for early starts, and gardening equipment. The snow plows and shovels have been replaced with lawn tractors and hoes. The department stores are stacked with summer shorts and t-shirts, flip flops and barbeque items. Easter freshness line the stores with colourful plates and decorations, bunnies and ducklings. If we opted for silence, so much the better, but standing there for however long it took, inevitably problems or school, or life would come to the fore and
