



Ruminations

It had been well over a decade since the last time I crossed the border. My new passport arrived two weeks ago, it had been expired since 2012. As I have said before, I have almost zero wanderlust and any car travel over an hour begins as prohibitively daunting. It takes a lot of inner coaxing to muster up the energy and desire to get in the car and go beyond the one hour radiance. It has taken four years to summon up the gumption to make the adventure across the border. It took five months to resolve to renew my passport and finally at noon on Thursday, I decided I was going to finally make the trek to Bowling Green, Ohio. To make it work I divided the travel into mini destinations. Instead of travelling about six hours, I was going for an hour to Cambridge; another hour to London; an hour to Chatham-Kent; an hour to Windsor; an hour to Toledo, Ohio; and finally half an hour to Bowling Green, Ohio. If it hadn't been for an almost 2 hour back up of trucks approaching the Ambassador Bridge and the border, everything would have gone to plan. Instead of a five and a half hour ride, it took me seven and a half hours. At the border crossing I presented my nice new passport and the customs officer asked me where I was going so I told him Bowling Green, Ohio. He asked me 'Why?' I was a little taken back at his tone. It was not an authoritative or commanding question, and it wasn't impolite or menacing. It was the attitude of someone who had been there and recognized that there was precious little reason for anyone other than university students to go there. Thankfully I had planned arriving the day before the hockey game I was going to see. My hotel was four buildings away from a Tim Hortons and supper at that late hour was a ham and cheese 'hoagie'. I had no idea what a 'hoagie' was but it looked pretty much like a bun. It was strange at the border reverting to miles per hour and gas by the gallon. When I first began driving, those were the units but now after over forty years of metric measurements, the imperial system seemed rather foreign. I'm still not sure what 70 miles an hour translates into kilometers. I just went with the flow. I had planned to tour a bit of Bowling Green before the evening hockey game so I googled things to do in Bowling Green. Other than the University, there was a mall where over half the stores were vacant, there was a Walmart Superstore, a Home Depot, and the highlight was a Krogers store which is a fancy grocery store. I couldn't find



WKRP on the radio though. So now I understand the attitude of the customs official in question why I was going to Bowling Green. It is certainly not a tourist mecca and thankfully the high passes by it and not through it. At least the Bowling Green Falcons won their game. Why indeed.


Theology On Tap


