February is proving to be a fascinating month. Maybe it is because it has an extra day this year. Or maybe because of the crazy lack of winter, except for a bit here and a bit there. Or maybe it is an aging thing and I am just more alert to the rhythms of nature. It is little things like needing to close blinds and curtains at particular times of the day because the sun is getting higher in the sky and blazing through windows. It is the brightness of the early morning when I step out to get the newspaper. It is seeing the first beams of light cast on the back of the fence. It can be the daffodils and tulips peaking up through the snowless garden beds. It is the ever lengthening daylight in the evenings racing towards the longest day of the year in June. It was visiting Bradford Greenhouses and seeing that the hanging baskets that will likely adorn my backyard already planted and growing. The morning risings are bright and inviting, the afternoons sunny are enticing, and the evenings are peacefully transitioning. And last night, well, it was an absolutely gorgeous full moon, the last full moon of winter or referred to as the Lenten moon. That is because the next full moon will occur after the vernal or spring equinox and the Sunday following that full moon is Easter. Still, with the crispness of a clear winter sky, the brilliant glow of the moon inspires wonder and awe. For whatever reason, winter night skies have always generated a sense of reverence. Maybe the cold makes the stars twinkle just a little bit brighter. Maybe the depth of the darkness gives a glimpse of the depths of the mystery of the universe. Some of my favorite wintertime memories are cold nights, laying in the snow staring in utter amazement at the eternal sky. They say that religion and faith begins precisely with those two emotions, wonder and awe. Let's face it, when one stands gazing at the mystery and beauty of the a bright full moon, or lies in the snow contemplating the vastness of the heavens, the unfathomability of universal time and distance, how could one not be overwhelmed by the wonder of our own smallness, yet our importance at being, as far as we know, privileged beings conscious of the magnitude and intricacy of the macrocosmic realm as well as the precision and intimacy of our own microcosmic existence. Lent is a time to get re-acquainted with wonder and awe. Our busy lives sometimes obscure these simple awe-inspiring realities and we lose touch with our unique position in creation. All this in one brief trip out my back door to



the torturous exercise of the gym and a quick glance at the full moon rising. Perhaps the moon's reference as the Lenten full moon is aptly and timely named.
