

In a sense it was an unanticipated, unplanned free night. It felt almost like cheating or playing hooky. Now if you remember last week's, I still have my Christmas tree up, so I dimmed the lights, put on some soft Christmas music, opened the patio curtains and watched the snow, listened to the wind howl, heard the ice pellets drum against the windows, and sipped hot chocolate. I could see the silhouetted naked maple tree in my backyard stiffly swaying in the wind, but then the pending deadline

of another edition of Ruminations was looming. So an unplanned evening off, and time to breathe made the morning crunch just a little bit easier, though maybe there will be another free snow day.




