Ruminations...

Many people I suppose have an aversion to hospitals. Hospitals can hold sad memories of loved ones dying, tragic events and other unhappy occasions. I must confess that it is not my choice to visit, although, since Southlake acquired a Druxy's store, things are looking up. I guess it is kind of an occupational hazard that I visit the hospital more often than most and certainly more often than I would like. I was born at Southlake and the first time I needed a procedure done there, about six years ago I needed to go for a couple of MRI's, I was still in the hospital data base. Over the years we have had to frequent the place for various reasons. Of course with my dad's heart conditions there were many trips in. There was an appendix, a blown knee, bowel resections, and happily the birth of five nephews and nieces. The recent adventures include the bladder chemotherapy for my mom. To date we have completed eleven rounds of the BCG treatments with one to go. This is not what most people think of with chemo. So on a snowy Tuesday morning I was rushing to drive to Our Lady of Grace parish to drop off the hospital beeper after my week with it, then get back up to the Landing to pick mom up and take her to Southlake for her 10:30 am appointment. The road conditions were not conducive to making good time. The roads were slick and snow covered and people were travelling well beneath the speed limit as the conditions warranted, which makes for a frustrating commute when you have deadlines. I am sure I was riding a couple of bumpers to the consternation of some anxious drivers - my apologies if you were one of them, but I had a deadline, and I hate being late (no comments are necessary concerning the start of some Masses). I reckon God knew the score and I hit almost every green light between Aurora and the Green Lane. So I was able to get mom to the hospital parking lot on time, but it was tough to find a parking spot, especially as snow plow piles took up some spots. We were ushered into the procedure room with the usual speed and efficiency, and things were going to plan. Then came the uncharacteristic wait, almost 2 hours for the doctor to arrive he was in the operating room we assume. Anyway, there was a lot of time to observe the facility and as impatience subsided into resignation, it afforded time to marvel at this facility. It won't win any design awards, but how lucky we are to have such resources. We were in but a small part of the hospital and yet the inventory of high tech medical items, from marvellous beds, blood pressure and temperature tools, oxygen outlets, computers, toxic disposal kits etc. etc. etc. The best though was



the vacuum tube apparatus that allows tubes of info to be sent and received all over the hospital. These buildings, filled with incredible equipment, devised by incredibly creative minds, with incredible people skilled in using them, when all was said and done, and we think of people around the world unable to access such miraculous care, it was well worth the wait. Oh, and mom's chemo went well, one more to go.
