

Ruminations...

Rafiki is one of my favorite Disney characters. He was an eccentric, priestly, prophetic sage in the movie the Lion King. The overture of the movie sang of the Circle of Life. The movie traced the life of a baby lion as he discovered his rightful place, or destiny if you will. We often talk of the circle or the rhythm of our lives. On a grand scale, it is a rather comforting and romantic, but in the nitty gritty and minutia of our lives, the twists and turns that cannot be found in the manual, well, it lose any romance. My family is in the midst of transition. Mom has been declining with dementia for a while, but recently it has plummeted. It was hard to discern, because mom never really worried about details. Navigation, details, directions, were always inconsequential so we were really unconcerned with mishaps or lost or forgotten items. Even when mom got down to 88 pounds, it was easily attributable to the colon cancer and bowel resection or the two bouts with bladder cancer all within six months. We decided it was time to take care of powers of attorney and her will. A week to the day they were finalized at the lawyers, we got our first real indication that something more was going on - mom was driving and ran out of gas at 10:30 at night in Elmira Ontario. Mom has no clue where Elmira is and she has no idea how or why she was there. Through a generous lady who found her on the side of the road, she contacted my brother who fetched her home. Well, we have been on a steep descent with mom. At the end of October she came to stay with me, the disease progressed and mom began leaving the rectory heading for various versions of home, either in Holland Landing or Oak Ridges. The disease was quickly becoming unmanageable for me, so she was placed on a crises list waiting for an emergency bed to open where she could be kept safe and secure, occupied and comfortable. A bed opened last week and we had two days to move her in. It was very difficult to accept the bed. My head knew that it was necessary and it was best for mom, but somehow my heart has not yet been adequately informed of that fact. It is a full gamut of mixed emotions. Transitions are so very tough. I'm not sure I even like this script the way it is unfolding, but there really is no choice. That being said, when my mom kept



introducing me to the staff and residents of her new abode as her husband, and they all believed her, it made the choice a lot less painful. I sure do miss my roommate though. \mathcal{P}_{r} . \mathcal{R}_{oy}
