Ruminations

Our summer days were pretty routine in a kind of structured way. Not that the days were laid out with every moment accounted for, but in the way that there was a rhythm to how our days unfolded. The typical schedule meant that we would spend a week out on the farm, usually around my aunts' annual Glorious 12th garden tea party, where these Orange Irish relatives would show off their papist grand nephews to all their old farming friends. It was a grand event with tables and chairs spread out over their massive front yard, and each table adorned with fresh Queen Anne's Lace and of course, orange lilies. It was our job to fetch, carry, and look charming. This was the time when my aunts provided us with new shorts and shirts, a uniform of sorts, pink top and navy bottoms. The saving grace for me is that they never got my size right, thankfully, and so my three brothers had to wear the uniform and I got to wear normal clothes. The other pillar of summer vacation was spending a week up at my aunts' cottage just outside of Sprucedale, north of Huntsville. It has its own lake and a canoe and loons and beaver, and we only ever saw bear footprints, but never the bear. As much as it was a fun week, I'm not so sure one would call it a vacation for mom. There was no running water, no indoor facilities, no electricity, and at night, the tiny scratching noise of mice scampering across the rafters could always be heard. Dad always had his vacation from work at the last three weeks of August and this meant that there was always a bit of a cloud hanging over the cottage adventures – school was starting soon. At home, there was always lacrosse games and baseball tournaments to attend to. The summer days were filled with typical neighbourhood shenanigans, lots of bike riding and games in the big open field, all possible with the 33 or so kids that lived in our little corner of the street. The almost cliché of staying out until the street lights came on was indeed the rule of thumb. Also during the summer, East Gwillimbury Recreation would host a week long summer camp at Anchor Park and a whole gang of us would walk the mile to the park carrying our brown bags of lunch, and a drink. Back then we would have peanut butter sandwiches in public and the only allergy I remember anyone having was to bee stings. That one person always carried an epi pen and over all the years, she never once got stung. It was kind of a mystical walk because along the way, there was a thick stand of pine trees and even the gentles breeze caused these pine trees to whisper a gentle song. It was the only time when our walk was silent. The only activity I remember vividly from the camp was the culminating scavenger hunt around Anchor Park and through the forest there. I remember the first year when I became acutely aware of 'summer vacation'. Without air conditioning, dad would turn on the blower on the furnace and all four of us would sleep on the floor crowded around the vent. One morning I woke up and heard mom listening to the radio. The song that was playing was Gordon Lightfoot's 'Steel Rail Blues'. That song became immediately engrained in my mind as the perfect summer anthem. To this day, whenever I hear it, Fall, Winter, Spring or Summer, it gives me a summer vibe and brings a relaxing summer mellow. Have a mellow summer.

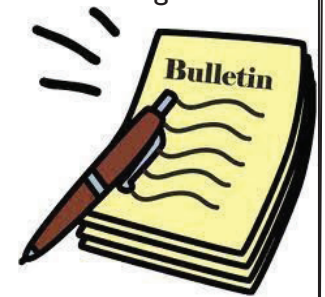
